HONORS DAY. The 1978 Honors Day program will be held May 4, 1978 at 11:00 a.m. in the Forum. UNITED WAY HONORS ISUE. Several years ago, due to ISUE's outstanding support of the United Way concept, ISUE received the Gold award, the highest award given to a supporting organization. DENNER AWARDED NSF GRANT. DR. MELVIN DENNER, professor of biology, was awarded a National Science Foundation grant of \$14,329.00. The grant will be used during an 18-month period to support a project to aid in the development of science/health teaching by elementary school teachers in Posey, Vanderburgh, and Warrick Counties.

The project will provide opportunities for twenty teachers of third, fourth, and fifth grades and teachers of physical education and health classes to improve their techniques of teaching anatomy and physiology.

In addition to Denner, other faculty instructors are DR. JACKSON MARR, associate professor of life science; DR. MARLENE SHAW, associate professor of life science; ANNE DENNER, instructor and registered nurse; DR. RICHARD BUCKNER, assistant professor of biology; and J. MAXWELL DAVIS, professor of life science and certification and licensing advisor. Other instructors are David Schmitt, City/County Health Educator; Jane Heramb, Vanderburgh County Extension Agent; and Nancy Davenport, District Dairy Council.

ISUE STUDENTS WIN CASE AT LAW DAY. ISUE and UE students conducted a "model trial" during Law Day held Monday, May 1, at the Old Courthouse.

PATRICK WALDEN and FRANK FABIANO, ISUE accounting majors, served as defense attorneys against two UE accounting majors who served as first year prosecutors for the State of Indiana.

The trial was a criminal case where the ISUE team argued successfully that murder charges against the defendant be dismissed because of self-defense. The jury was composed of 12 high school students from the Evansville area. Their verdict was that all charges should be dismissed.

Court was presided over by John Brinson, an assistant to the Circuit Court Judge.

Witnesses from ISUE were students ROBERT DYE, JEFF WILSON, PAT DOUGAN, and TOM SPALDING.

Cole Banks, Evansville attorney and ISUE adjunct faculty member, recommended the ISUE students for the program.
