USI Board of Trustees request science/education classroom building

The USI Board of Trustees approved the capital improvement budget request for 1999-2001 at the board meeting June 19. The budget request's top capital priority is construction of a science/education classroom building. The facility will provide general and specialized classrooms, computer, multi-media, and teaching/research laboratories for the Schools of Science and Engineering Technology, Education and Human Services, and University Division's Advising and Academic Skills department.

President H. Ray Hoops said the building was needed to support increased student enrollment and

program expansion in science and education; promote collaboration to incorporate modern instructional technology into the science, mathematics, and teacher education curricula, and to increase student retention with improved academic and support services. Estimated cost of the building is \$21.6 million. If legislative approval is given next spring, the anticipated date of completion is July 2002.

The need for additional academic space continues to concern the administration. Even with the completion of the Liberal Arts Center in fall 1999, there still will be a significant space deficit. Dr. Hoops said, "Construction of the Science/Education

classroom Building is needed to maintain the quality of the University's educational programs necessitated by the University's expanding enrollment."

In the past ten years, enrollment at the University has increased by 80 percent from 4,624 students in the fall of 1987 to 8,300 students last fall. A notable change in the student population is the increase in the number of full-time students from 3,173 in 1987 to 6,314 in 1997.

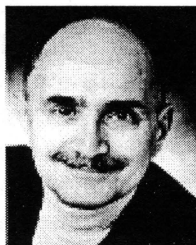
The next step in the approval process will be the Indiana Commission for Higher Education, which ranks funding priorities among state institutions of higher education before submitting to the state legislature.

Television and Broadway star featured in *Death of a Salesman*

Television and stage notable **Mr. Gil Rogers** will be featured as Willy Loman in The New Harmony Theatre's production of Arthur Miller's classic drama *Death of a Salesman* opening Friday, July 10, and running through Sunday, July 26.

A daytime drama mainstay on CBS's *The Guiding Light* and ABC's *All My Children*, Rogers also was seen as the title role in *The Great White Hope* on Broadway opposite James Earl Jones. Rogers' other Broadway credits include a two-year run as the sheriff in *The Best Little Whorehouse In Texas* and *The Corn Is Green* with Cecily Tyson. He portrayed Hawk Shayne on *The Guiding Light* and Ray Gardner on *All My Children*.

imposing task. He is a great talent - recognized by daytime television and film audiences, and known in the theatre world as an outstanding legitimate actor; we are lucky to have him coming to New Harmony," said **Mr. Scott LaFeber**, artistic director.

Rogers replaces Mr. Louis Zorich, who was originally slated to play the lead role, but declined for health reasons.

Death of a Salesman, NHT's second

show of the summer season, also will feature Obie award-winner and Dublin's Actress of the Year award-winner Jacqueline Brookes as Willy's wife Linda, and Apollo Dukakis (co-founder of the Tony-award nominated Whole Theatre with his sister Olympia Dukakis) as Charley.

Mr. Rogers' additional credits include a recent Off-Broadway production of "On Deaf Ears" and performances in regional theatres from Flat Rock, N.C. to The Shakespeare Festival in San Diego. Among his twenty films, *Eddie Macon's Run*, *Pretty Poison*, *W.W. and the Dixie Dance Kings*, and the soon-to-be-released *Cherry* are the most notable.

Married to Margaret Hall (Gertie on A.M.C.'s *Remember W.E.N.N.*), they are the proud parents of Amanda Hall

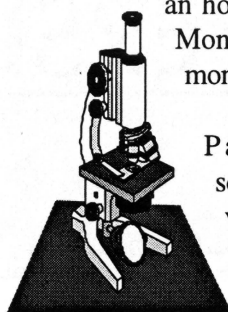

an hour on the third Monday of each month.

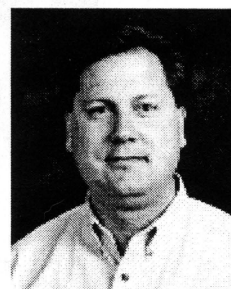

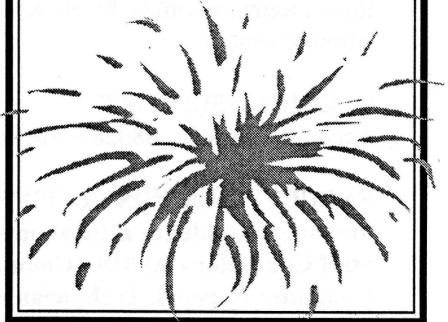

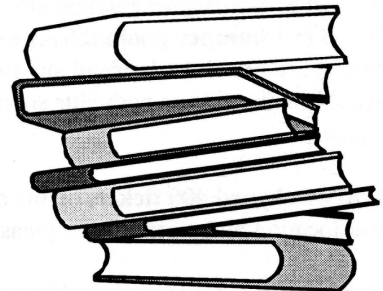
