Persons interested in graduate business programs invited to USI in March

An information session about University of Southern Indiana graduate programs leading to a Master of Business Administration (MBA) degree or the Master of Science in Accountancy (MSA) degree will be held at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, March 14 in the University Center, Rms. 206 and 214. All interested persons are welcome to this free session.

Dr. Marwan Wafa, associate dean of the USI School of Business and director of the MBA program, will conduct the MBA portion of the program. Dr. Dan Wade, director of accounting programs, will cover the MSA program. Both programs are designed with the professional in mind. Classes are held in the evening.

The MBA program is designed to foster and enhance the managerial skills and capabilities of students. The MBA curriculum provides an educational foundation crucial for success in today's business world. Courses are taught by qualified faculty who, through scholarly work and consulting activities, are at the forefront of their disciplines.

The Master of Science in Accountancy can further students' personal and professional development and enhance their ability to provide traditional accounting, auditing, and tax services parallel with financial planning, evaluation, and technology. For persons interested in sitting for the Certified Public Accountant exam, this degree will fulfill the 150-hour state requirement of university education that is in effect in Indiana, Illinois, and Kentucky this year.
