OFF CAMPUS CLASSES. This spring the Office of Continuing Education will offer three credit undergraduate classes at Castle High School in Warrick County: Modern Computing Techniques (Business 251), Introduction to Interpersonal Communications (Communications 104), and Principles of Microeconomics (Economics 103).
