



INTERNATIONALLY KNOWN PIANIST TO PERFORM.

Internationally-known pianist Curtis Stotlar will perform at ISUE Thursday, August 31 at 12:30 p.m. in Room 28 of the Administration Building. Sponsored by the Humanities Forum, the program is free and open to the public.

Currently a faculty member of the Conservatory at Neuilly, near Paris, Stotlar's program will consist of works from Chopin, Liszt, and Scriabin.

Stotlar began playing the piano at age three and began serious study at age 11. When he was 14, he composed and orchestrated a "Piano Concerto" which he later performed, winning the Interlochen Press Composition Prize.

He received a Bachelor of Music degree from the Eastman School of Music where he studied under Frank Glazer and Eugene List. He continued his studies at Julliard School in New York and received the M.S. degree in Music as a student of Beveridge Webster. He has taught piano at Southern Illinois University and Vassar College.

Moving to Paris, Stotlar continued his study of music with Nadia Boulanger and piano with Wilhelm Kempff, Philippe Entremont, and Robert Casadeus. For two consecutive years, he was awarded the Wooley Scholarship for performing musicians and artists from the American Foundation of the University of Paris.

Stotlar has performed throughout Europe, Africa and Asia, and has appeared on many national television and radio networks including the BBC, the French ORTF, KRO in the Netherlands, and the prestigious NBC television show "Today."

He has received outstanding reviews throughout the world. According to Igor Stravinsky, Stotlar is ". . . more than a pianist - a true artist."
