Holdgrive and his cohorts Mark Waldrop and Bruce Coyle were commissioned by the Cincinnati Playhouse to compile a musical revue of Cole Porter songs. Because of the shows immediate popularity, arrangements have been made with the Cole Porter Trust to perform the show across the country. The New Hamony Theatre is produced by the University of Southern Indiana with performances housed at two historic theatres in New Harmony, Indiana, — Murphy Auditorium and Thralls Opera House.
