Exhibition of contemporary ceramics to come to New Harmony

Gamble, John Goodheart, Dick Hay, Linda Hoffhines, Yih-Wen Kuo, Katherine Ross, Dee Schaad, Randall Schmidt, Virginia Scotchie and Rimas VisGirda.

"I chose individuals with whom I have a connection; either through a direct tie or by being bonded with them in friendship," said Dowhie. "Regardless, all the artists have earned my respect and admiration for their art and I assumed they would approach this exhibition with their tongues in their cheeks and their ideas on their sleeves."

A reception for "50 Shades of Clay" will be held at the New Harmony Gallery of Contemporary Art from 4 to 7 p.m. Saturday, November 21, during the final art and antique stroll of 2015.
