2009 BASEBALL SEASON OUTLOOK

The University of Southern Indiana baseball team hopes to keep rolling when it starts the 2009 season.

The Screaming Eagles are coming off a 2008 season that saw them win a conference regular season crown for the first time in 15 seasons, winning the GLVC West Division with a 24-7 mark. USI also posted a 36-20 overall record, reaching at least 30 wins for the second consecutive year, the first time since the 1993 and 1994 campaigns.

USI Head Coach **Tracy Archuleta** begins his third season with the Eagles and has won 79 of 122 games in his first two seasons at the helm. He will have a squad that has 13 returning players, five redshirted players from last season, and 11 newcomers.

THE PITCHING STAFF

The key to any successful season always comes down to pitching and Archuleta has one of the best in finishing off games in senior All-American closer **Shaun Larsen**.



Larsen, who was the NCAA Division II top reliever last season, broke the USI single-season and career records for saves with 17 a year ago.

To get to those late innings and Larsen, the Eagles will have a re-built starting rotation. Gone are Jeremy Kehrt, who was drafted by the Boston Red Sox after last season's All-GLVC performance, and Corey Julian, who was the number one starter a year ago.

Leading the returning pitchers will be senior right-hander **Matt Nichols** and junior right-hander **Casey Geiger**. Nichols successfully returned to the staff last season to post a 2-3 record and a 4.50 ERA in 11 games and seven starts after sitting out 2007 with an injury.

Geiger will be making the switch from the bullpen to the

starting rotation this spring. He was steady out of the pen last year, going 7-3 with a team-best 2.75 ERA in a team-high 30 appearances. Geiger also was fifth on the team with 38 strikeouts in 55.2 innings of work.

Also returning to the staff this season is senior right-hander **Michael Dewig** and sophomore right-hander **Trevor Leach**. Dewig was 3-0 out of the pen with a 3.45 ERA, while Leach was a surprise last season going 1-1 with a 3.51 ERA.

The Eagles also will look to a pair of junior college prospects in junior right-hander **D.J. Smith** and sophomore right-hander **Cody Brandenstein** to contribute right away. Smith had a two-year record at Olney Central College of 7-2 with 62 strikeouts in 67 2/3 innings pitched. Smith also had a 3.47 ERA in helping lead OCC to a 32-14 record in 2008.

Brandenstein, who saw action in three games out of the bullpen as a freshman at Wabash Valley College, was first team All-SIAC as a senior in 2007 after helping Mater Dei High School (Evansville, Indiana) to the 2007 Indiana State finals.

USI also has a stable of young arms on the staff - redshirt

freshman **Shad Macke** and freshmen right-handers **Zach Binder, Ross David**, and **Ryan Lindquist** -- that will vie for innings. David was 8-1 with a 1.30 ERA last season for Mt. Vernon High School (Mt. Vernon, Indiana) with 89 strikeouts in 54 2/3 innings of work.

INFIELDERS

The Eagles' infield has been solid the last two seasons and returns half of the starters from last season. Leading the way are senior pitcher/infielder Alex Thieroff and shortstop Wes Fink.

Thieroff, who will likely split time between third and first base this season was an All-GLVC

third sacker last year after hitting .300. He also was second on the team with four home runs and 34 RBIs, while producing a team-best four triples.



USI also will look for Thieroff to contribute on the mound. Thieroff, who combined with P.J. Thomas in his first start to no-hit Oakland City University, had a 3.60 ERA in a pair of no-decision starts.

Fink batted .280 during his first season with the Eagles, tying for the team-lead with five home runs and driving in 31 RBIs.

Joining the infield crew is three redshirts from last season in sophomore **Ben Griggs**, freshman **Chase Holzmeyer**, and freshman **Brad Vance**. Vance saw action in two games last season before sitting out the season with an injury.

New to the program this year are junior infielder/right-handed pitcher **Tyler Choate** and junior third baseman **Nick Jewell**.

Choate, who is expected to be a starting pitcher in addition to seeing action in the infield, becomes an Eagle after two seasons as a Saluki at Southern Illinois University Carbondale as a dual position player. He produced a career batting average of .258 with 19 RBIs, 23 runs scored, and seven doubles in 51 games at SIU, while recording a 5-2 mark on the mound with a 4.29 ERA in 71.2 innings of work.

CATCHERS

The major replacement of 2008 will be at the catcher. USI lost Garrett Oros, who expertly handled the pitching staff and made 90 starts the last two seasons.

One option to fill Oros' shoes is sophomore back-stop **Nate Noland**. Noland made 25 appearances last season, making 10 starts, and batted .273.

Eagles also can turn to redshirt junior **Kyle Rowley**, sophomore transfer **Dylan Mooney**, and freshman **Zach Wilkinson**. Rowley came to USI from St. Catharine College (St. Catharine, Kentucky), where he batted .337 with 22 RBIs, 12 runs scored, and eight doubles before sitting out last season.

Mooney transferred to USI after a year at Saint Louis Community College-Meramec. He was the team captain as a freshman and batted .237 with eight RBIs in 35 games. The sophomore back-stop also had four doubles, one triple, and one home run during his first collegiate year.

OUTFIELD

The Eagles have a solid core of returning players in the outfield for 2008, led by All-GLVC outfielder/designated hitter **Chad Werry**. Werry was fourth on the team in hitting during 2008 with a .298 batting average, while tying for the team lead with five home runs. He also drove in 32 runs, while scoring 25 more.

In addition to Werry, the Eagles also return senior outfielders **Royle Beach** and **Chad Bruce** and junior outfielder/designated hitter **Caleb Ehmke**. Beach started 51 of his 54 appearances, batting .279 with 19 stolen bases, 32 runs scored, and 17 RBIs.

Ehmke made 41 appearances, 31 starts, and hit .287 after a slow start. He also knocked in 23 RBIs and scored 28 runs.

To supplement and add depth to the outfield, the Eagles have added junior transfer **Brad Mangold**.

Mangold came to USI after two years at Wabash Valley Junior College (Mt. Carmel, Illinois) where he batted .306 with 12 RBIs, six doubles, and three triples as a sophomore. He had a .311 batting average in 48 games with three home runs and 22 RBIs during his first season with Wabash Valley.

USI BASEBALL COACHING STAFF Tracy Archuleta



Head Baseball Coach

Tracy Archuleta is off to the fastest pace of any USI baseball coach in the history of the program. Archuleta has won 79 games in two seasons at the helm and taken the squad back into the regional and national spotlight.

Archuleta's first Eagles team made their first appearance in the final four of the NCAA Division II Baseball Championship and won their first ever NCAA Division II North Central Regional championship. USI also set a school record by posting 43 victories, 25 wins better than the year before.

The Eagles and Archuleta finished their first season together ranked fourth nationally; had a 43-23 overall record; and 24-15 in the GLVC. USI placed second in the GLVC regular season and fourth in the conference tournament.

For his efforts, Archuleta was named the ABCA North Central Region Coach of the Year in 2007.

In the second season, Archuleta and the Eagles won their first GLVC West Division and the first conference regular season title in 15 years. USI finished the year with 36 victories during the regular schedule, tying for third all-time in the history of the program.

The Eagles also were ranked as high as sixth nationally in 2008.

Archuleta came to USI after five seasons at the University of Wisconsin-Parkside that featured a pair of NCAA Division II Tournament appearances and a pair of 40-win seasons. UW-Parkside also advanced to the NCAA II North Central Regional title game in 2005 and was 148-124 (.544) during Archuleta's tenure.

After setting the foundation during his first two years, Archuleta directed the Rangers into the national spotlight with a 41-18 season in 2004, finishing on top of the GLVC standings and earning the school's firstever NCAA II Tournament bid. Between 2002 and 2004, UW-Parkside went from 13 wins to 41 wins. Archuleta's Rangers continued their march in 2005, this time with a 45-18 record, picking up the school's first GLVC baseball championship along the way. Again, the club made the NCAA II Tournament, reaching the regional championship game. The 2005 team broke the school record for wins in a season, set by the 2004 squad. In each of those two seasons, the Rangers finished among the top 25 teams in the nation.

In his tenure at UW-Parkside, Archuleta coached the Rangers first All-American, Regional Player of the Year, GLVC Player of the Year, and he had two players sign professional contracts and 11 players earn All-Region honors. He was tabbed GLVC Coach of the Year in 2004.

Archuleta served as an assistant coach for five seasons at Wayne State College (Nebraska) and Central Missouri State University at the NCAA II level before taking the top spot at UW-Parkside.

At Wayne State, he was the infield coach, hitting coach, and recruiting coordinator on the team that captured its first NSIC championship and NCAA II regional birth in the 2001 season. Archuleta helped guide the team's batting average to 25th in the country (2000) and, in 2001, the squad was third in the country in fielding percentage (.969). In 2001, Wayne State finished 26th in the country with a record of 35-10.



During his tenure at CMSU, the Mules won the regular season conference

championship with a record of 20-1 and were ranked as high as fifth in the nation. The team picked up an NCAA tournament bid and finished 16th in the country with a 43-10 mark. Archuleta was CMSU's outfield coach and recruiting coordinator. He also assisted the hitters.

The native of Iliff, Colorado, earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Metropolitan State College of Denver and has a master's degree in education from Wayne State College. He has three children, Mikaela, 14, Alex, 8, and Samuel, 5.

Joel Weaver Assistant Baseball Coach

Joel Weaver helped develop the USI baseball pitching staff the last two seasons that broke the squads single-season strikeout record twice. The pitching staff also has generated 79 victories, including a school record 43 in 2007, under his tutelage.

Weaver joined the USI staff after two seasons with the Wayne State College (Nebraska) baseball program. He was responsible for working with the pitchers, recruiting, and camp at WSC While at WSC in 2005 and 2006, the Wildcats led the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference in wins, saves, and strikeouts. Weaver also helped direct a staff to the conference's best ERA in 2006. The Wildcats hurlers earned six NSIC All-Conference awards, two NSIC Pitcher of the Year honors, and three All-Region accolades in two seasons under Weaver.

Prior to joining the WSC staff, Weaver spent one year as a student assistant at his alma mater, the University of Wisconsin-Parkside. Weaver also pitched four seasons for UW-Parkside and was a member of the staff that ranked first nationally in ERA in 2000. He also set the Ranger record for career appearances (65).

Weaver, a native of West Allis, Wisconsin, earned a bachelor's degree from UW-Parkside and a master's degree from WSC in sports management.

Dustin Murray Assistant Baseball Coach

Dustin Murray enters his third season with the Eagles, specializing in working with the hitters and the catchers. During his first season, the Eagles improved their batting average 42 points in 2007.

Murray came to USI after spending the 2006 season as a student assistant on Tracy Archuleta's staff at UW-Parkside. He played three seasons for UW-Parkside after transferring from Lethbridge Community College, where he led

his team to the 2002 Canadian championship.

The native of Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, played in 92 games for UW-Parkside during his three seasons. He batted .281 with 14 RBIs and 14 runs scored as a senior in 2005, helping lead the Rangers to the GLVC championship and the NCAA Division II North Central Regional finals.

Murray graduated from UW-Parkside last May with a bachelor's degree in sports and fitness management.







The University of Southern Indiana was founded on the banks of the Ohio River in Evansville in 1965. USI is a comfortable drive from the major metropolitan centers of Indianapolis, Cincinnati, Louisville, Nashville, and St. Louis.



The University enrolls 10,126 students and offers undergraduate majors in 70 areas of study. An ever-increasing number of post-graduate programs also are available to students who wish to continue their education. Opportunities are available for service learning, study abroad, and internships.



Outside the classroom, students have opportunities to participate in more than 90 organizations offering co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Special interest clubs, student government, sororities and fraternities, music and drama groups, and other organizations enable the students to enjoy and contribute to campus life.



Science and Education Center



The more than 3,000 students living on campus have their choice of two types of housing.
