ISUE SIGNS HOLLINDEN. The ISUE Screaming Eagles have landed John Hollinden who, at 7'6", is the nation's tallest basketball player. Hollinden has accepted an athletic grant to ISUE terminating his ties with Oral Roberts University.

Hollinden starred at Evansville Central and was named to Coach and Athlete magazine's All American team. He averaged 19.5 points per game and averaged 12 rebounds in his senior year.

He will be forced to sit out a year due to the NCAA transfer rule, but it will enable him to undertake an extensive weight-training program to improve his strength and weight. He will be redshirted this season but will have two years of eligibility remaining. According to COACH WAYNE BOULTINGHOUSE, the signing of Hollinden is "the biggest thing that's happened to us. This probably will push our program ahead for 8 to 10 years . . . We won't have to contact people for scheduling of games. They will be contacting us."

The signing of Hollinden brings ISUE's recruits to four - including Washington's John Brown, Jasper's Mark Block and Southeastern Illinois' 6'7" transfer John Alexander. BOULTINGHOUSE has one scholarship remaining.

A seven-year employee of ISUE, DOLORES JOCHIM of the Counseling Center can be described as being "people-oriented." 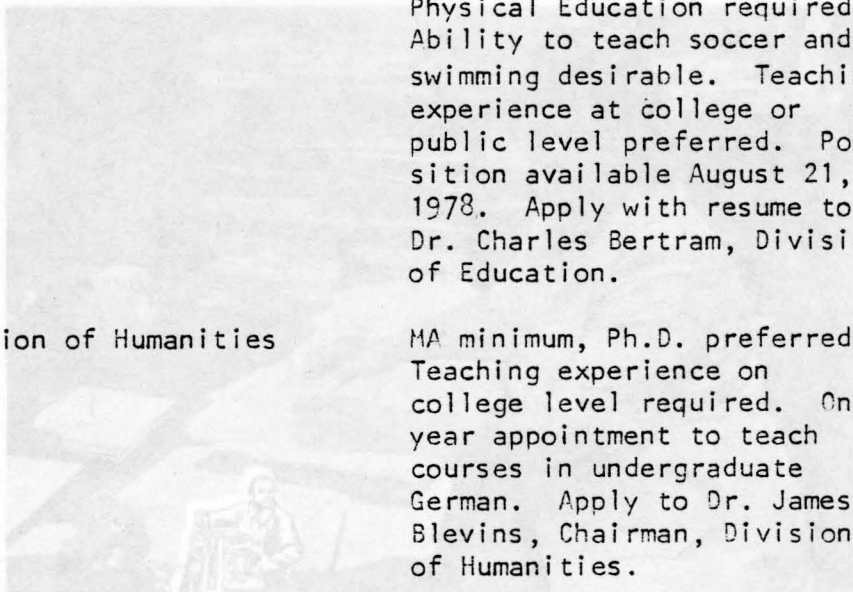
