Four educators have joined the faculty this fall in the School of Education and Human Services at the University of Southern Indiana, including:

Dr. Kathleen M. Filkins, instructor in teacher education; she received a B.A. from Hendrix College, Arkansas; M.S. from the University of Iowa, Iowa City; and Ph.d. from the University of Texas-Austin. She previously was an assistant professor at East Texas State, a grant coordinator at Texas Woman's University, and a middle and elementary school teacher.

Daniel P. Heil, instructor in physical education; he received a B.S. and M.S. from Oregon State University, Corvallis, and is completing work on a doctorate at the University of Massachusetts, where he was a graduate research/teaching assistant. He also was a teaching assistant at Oregon State. *

Dr. William Jack Neumeier, assistant professor of education; he received a B.S. and Ph. D. from Miami University, Ohio, and M.S. from Indiana University. He was an adjunct professor at Miami and also was a school psychologist for nine years and a counselor/elementary teacher for 12 years in Ohio.

Dr. Donna Stieg Wasson, assistant professor of teacher education; she received a B.S. magna cum laude from Texas A&M, an elementary teaching license from the University of Washington, Seattle, where she did graduate work, and a Ph.D. from Indiana University. She has taught at IU and a middle school in Berlin, Germany, was a bilingual/bicultural elementary teacher in Houston, Texas, and also taught for the Department of Defense Dependent Schools out of Arlington, Virginia. *
