CURRICULAR COMMITTEE REPORT

The Curricular Committee met on November 13 and gave initial approval to the following new course: Economics 345 (The Soviet Economy) (3). A survey of Soviet economics theory and institutions covering the following topics: Soviet ideology; economic development of the USSR 1917-1950; growth and performance 1950-1965; institutions for central planning; problems of central planning; current problems of the Soviet economy for reform; comparative evaluation of the Soviet economy.

A petition for History 448 Europe 1650-1815 has been approved by all necessary agencies and received final approval from Dean Donald Bennett on November 15, 1972.

FOUNDATION DEVELOPS NEW PROJECT

The Indiana State University Evansville Foundation Board of Directors announced the Donor Recognition Program as a Foundation project made possible by the development of the University Center at the Groundbreaking ceremonies for that building on November 8, 1972. A mailing to 2000 tri-state residents informing them of the program was sent last week.

The major thrust of the Donor Recognition Program is to provide opportunities for interested individuals, organizations and companies to furnish rooms or area in the University Center and Continuing Education Wing and to recognize the donor by asking the donor to specify the name that will be used in the naming of the room and the nameplate information to be displayed for designating the rooms.

A brochure explaining the program was developed and used in the mailing, and copies of the brochure will be made available to the administration, faculty, and staff when printing of the second edition is completed. If persons on the faculty or staff feel they know a family, individuals, companies or civic groups that may be interested in the program, they are asked to contact Kathy Will in the President's Office and she can send the mailing to the interested party.

Joseph E. O'Daniel, President of the ISUE Foundation, urges community support in the Donor Recognition Program and says, "This is not an organized campaign to raise funds, but rather an effort to inform the community and individuals of the opportunities and to seek out community interest in participating in the Donor Recognition Program."
