SPRING RECESS. There will be no classes during the week of Spring Recess, Monday, March 24 through Friday, March 28, 1975. Offices will be closed on Good Friday, March 28, 1975. Good Friday is among the holidays granted with pay to all full-time, regular employees except those in positions in which continuous service must be maintained.

GERMAN CHURCH SERVICES HELD LOCALLY. Faculty, staff and students involved in the study of German will be interested to know that a Church Service in the German language will be held on Good Friday, March 28, 1975, at 10:00 a.m. in the Chapel of St. Paul's United Church of Christ at 227 West Michigan St. (at W. Michigan and 12th Avenue). This has become a tradition in Evansville on Good Friday and Christmas morning, with the Rev. Manfred Haas delivering a sermon in the German language. Liturgy as well as hymns are in German (text is provided at the service). Charles Lonnberg, Director of the Library, will sing a solo in German, "Jerusalem, die Heilige."

This would be an excellent opportunity for anyone interested in the German language and culture to learn how a traditional Protestant Church Service (Evangelischer Gottesdienst) is conducted in Germany.

ISUE HOST TO HIGH SCHOOL COUNSELORS AND PRINCIPALS. Bring back those good of high school days. That's what the Office of Admissions will be doing on Wednesday, April 2. It is helpful to secondary school administrators to get feedback from their former students so that certain weak academic areas in the high school can be identified and improved. Also, to be aware of their former students' feelings about ISUE, helps the counselor advise other high school students interested in ISUE.

There will be many visitors on campus April 2. Let's make them feel welcome.
