ISUE TELECONFERENCE SEMINAR. An exciting new development in communication technology will allow individuals gathered at Indiana State University Evansville and 49 other universities around the country to listen to and interact with four noted experts in productivity, January 28. This new technology, video teleconferencing, involves the transmission of audio and visual images and provides for interaction between receiving and originating sites.

"Facing the Challenge of Productivity in America" is the first video teleconference offered by the National University Teleconference Network (NUTN), an organization of 67 prominent universities interested in telecommunications.

The day-long seminar will be held in Room 194 of the Science Center from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. The fee for the teleconference is \$95.00 per person which covers all printed materials, including discussion guides, case studies, and a bibliography.
