Dr. Marek Dabrowski, deputy minister of finance in Poland, will be featured in a series of programs Thursday, October 11, at the University of Southern Indiana.

Dr. Dabrowski will be a guest at a breakfast at 7 a.m. in the University Center Dining Room, then will be featured speaker at a second program on international business opportunities, sponsored by the Office of Continuing Education. The program will begin at 8 a.m. in the University Center, where Dr. Dabrowski will discuss "The Polish Economy: From Plan to Market," including the Polish Recovery Program after 1989, Polish X Day (January 1, 1990), austerity measures for 1991, privatization, and foreign investment options and opportunities.

At 7 p.m., Dr. Dabrowski will speak in the third of the USI Silver Anniversary Series of International Speakers, also to be held in the University Center.

A \$10 fee covers both the breakfast and morning program; reservations are requested by Monday, October 8, by calling 464-1989. The evening program is free. Both are open to the public.

Dr. Dabrowski is a graduate of Warsaw University and the Institute of Planning in Warsaw. He has worked in several research institutes and prior to his current position, was associate professor at the Institute of Economic Science at the Polish Academy of Science.

He became a member of a team of economists in 1978, working under the auspices of the Institute for Economic Development, Central School of Planning and Statistics, who developed a blueprint of economic reform that was published in 1980 and considered then to be the most radical market-oriented proposal to restructure the Polish economic system.
