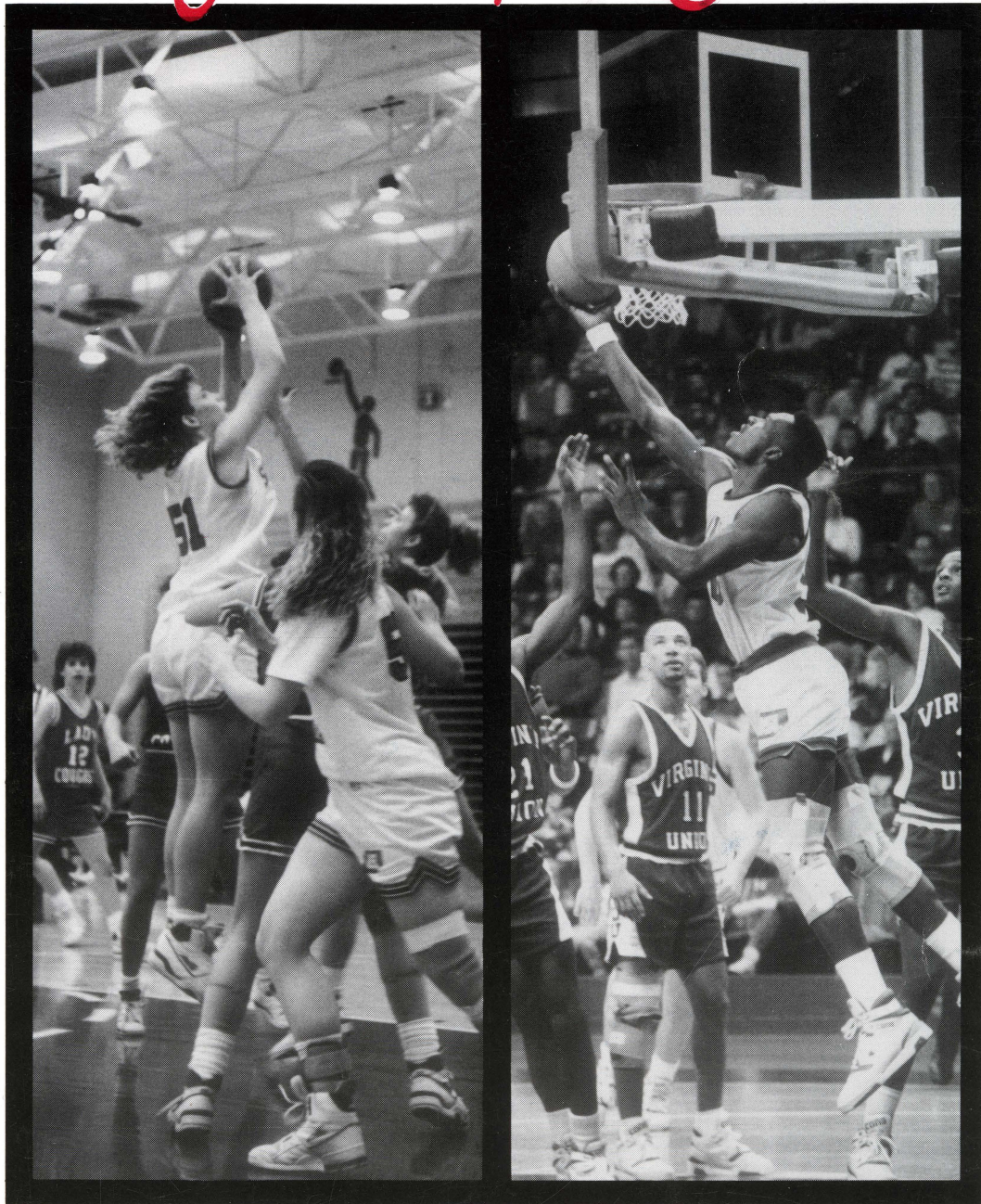

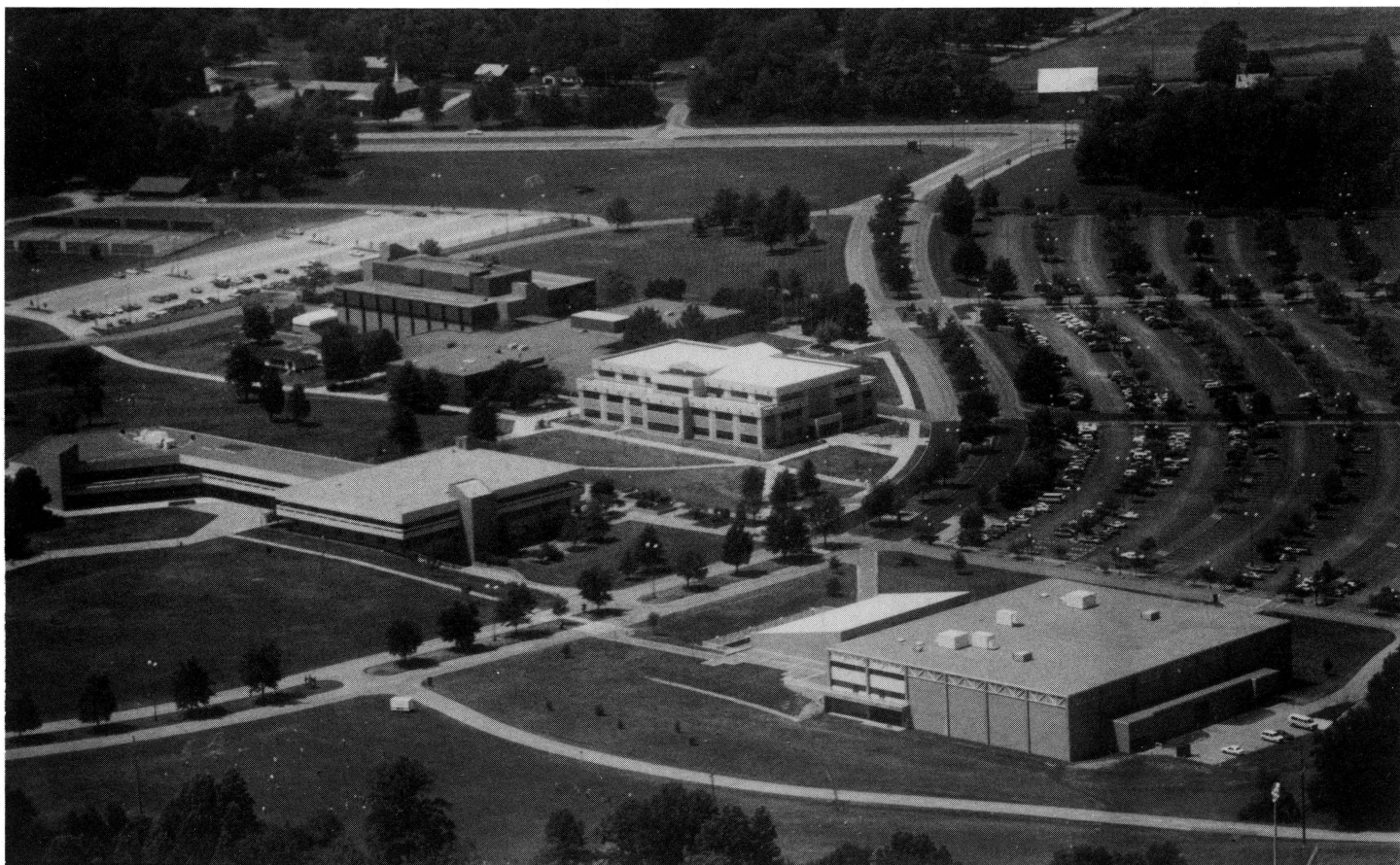

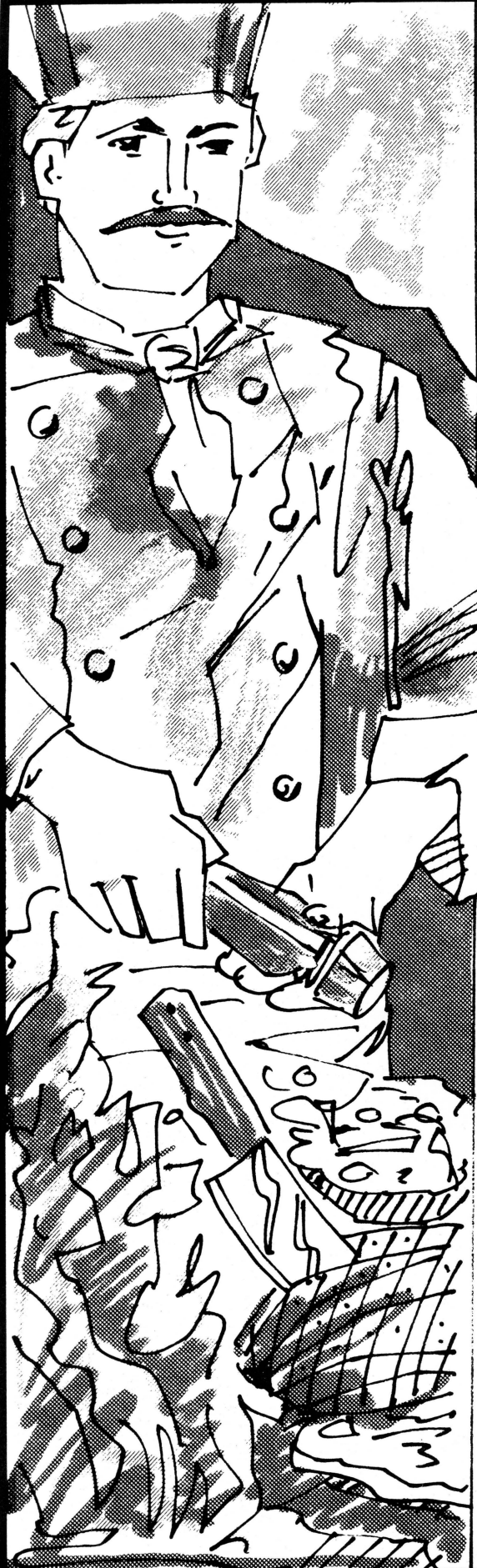

Message from Dr. David Rice, *President*

Welcome to the University of Southern Indiana and Screaming Eagles basketball. The basketball season is anxiously awaited each year because of its promise for excitement. Our men's and women's athletic program provides the opportunity for our student athletes to demonstrate their considerable skills in intercollegiate competition while giving those of us who are spectators limitless opportunities for entertainment and fellowship. The games allow students, alumni, faculty, and friends of the University another way to show our pride in our University as well as in our student athletes who so ably represent it.

Thank you for the support you give the University and its athletic program, but most importantly, to its student athletes whose achievements we cheer in and out of the classroom.

About the University

The University of Southern Indiana became Indiana's sixth state university on July 1, 1985, after twenty years as a regional campus. It is a comprehensive university excelling in undergraduate instruction in more than sixty academic majors. USI confers master's degrees in business administration, industrial management, secondary education and liberal arts. The University of Southern Indiana also offers continuing education courses, business and professional seminars, and community service programs through its Office of Continuing Education and Extended Services.

This fall, entering its 26th year of service, the University's enrollment reached 6,480 students. It expects to serve an additional 6,000 people in noncredit programs during the academic year. The University's enrollment has grown dramatically in the last five years and reflects greater numbers of students from the southern Indiana region.

When the University first opened its doors on September 15, 1965, there were 412 students who attended classes in temporary quarters in the Centennial School Building. The present campus, located in the 1400-acre Mid-America University Center, was developed according to a master plan and includes five major structures. The Science Center and Administration Building opened in 1969, followed by the Library in 1971, the University Center in 1974, the Technology Center in 1975, and the Physical Activities Center in 1980, and the Robert D. Orr Center in 1990. The Physical Activities Center, known as the PAC, houses the PAC Arena, the home court for USI athletic events.

The University of Southern Indiana is governed by a nine-member Board of Trustees appointed by the Governor of Indiana. Members of the Board are Mr. Joseph E. O'Daniel, chairman, of Evansville; Dr. Percy Clark, Jr., vice chairman, of Indianapolis; Mr. Bruce Baker, vice chairman, of Boonville; Dr. George Weathersby, secretary, of Indianapolis; Mr. Charles Combs of Terre Haute; Mr. Thomas McKenna of Indianapolis; Mrs. Carole Rust of Mt. Vernon; Mr. Brad A. Schepers of Celestine; Mrs. Harolyn Torain of Indianapolis.

The University is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools for programs through the master's level, and by other accrediting agencies for programs in allied health, education, engineering technology, and nursing.

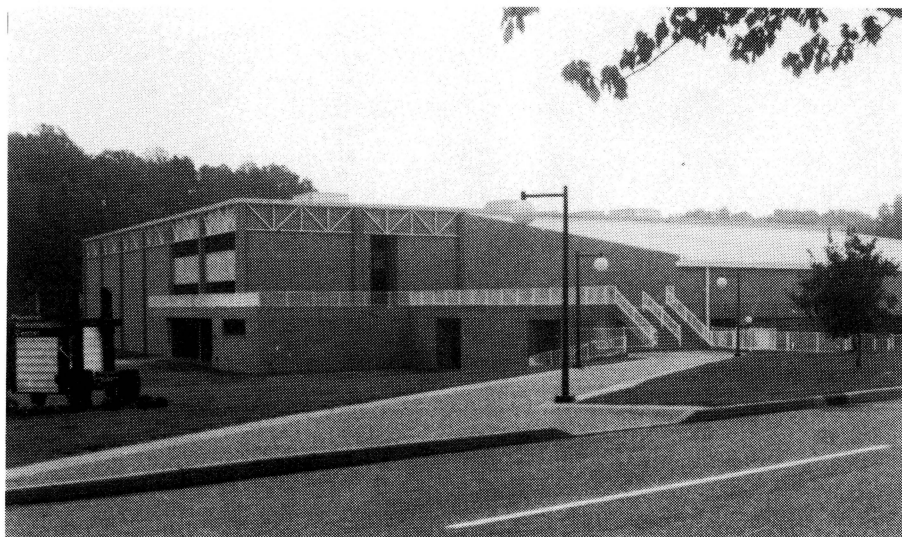

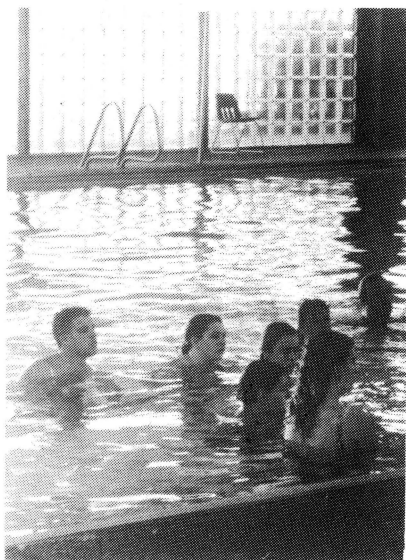

THE PHYSICAL ACTIVITIES CENTER:

The Physical Activities Center (PAC), home of Screaming Eagles basketball, was built and opened in 1980. The building, constructed at a cost of \$4.4 million, originally was called the Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building (HPER). The building accommodates all physical education classes, intramural activities, student recreation, and provides an on-campus arena for USI basketball.



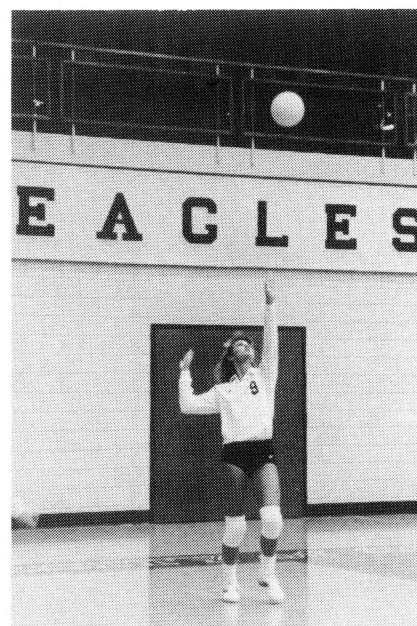
The Physical Activities Center opened to the public October 3, 1980.

Contained in the PAC is a multipurpose activity area, a gymnastics and dance module, an aquatics area, physical therapy and weight training rooms, four general classrooms, men's and women's locker rooms, and offices for educational and athletic personnel.

The multipurpose activity area is the most versatile section of the structure. It can support several activities simultaneously when the floor-to-ceiling curtains separate it into three teaching modules. Without the curtains, it can accommodate activities of a larger scope. It houses indoor intramural activities as well.

The gymnastics and dance module, containing a wide array of equipment, overlooks the multipurpose activity area and complements the other teaching unit. A 25-meter swimming pool with one- and three-meter diving boards is located in the aquatics area, which is enclosed for year-round use. The weight training and physical therapy rooms are important support components for all activities in the building.

For spectator athletic events and public forums in the multipurpose area, chairback and bleacher seating can be moved into place on sides of the room. These spectator capabilities were made possible through generous donations from the businesses and individuals in the Southwestern Indiana community. More than \$300,000 was raised by the USI Foundation in the Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building Fund Drive.



The PAC is home to 10 intercollegiate teams.

In addition to regularly scheduled credit and noncredit classes, health maintenance and open recreation periods are available so as many persons as possible may benefit from participating in lifetime physical activity. Information on use of the building is available by calling the PAC counter at 464-1945.

The PAC also houses special events for USI such as concerts, convocations, commencements and other activities which require large floor areas and spectator capabilities.

**Head Coach
Dr. Lionel Sinn**

Dr. Lionel Sinn enters his third season as head coach of the Screaming Eagles after leading the team to a 21-10 record last season. The 1989-90 accomplishments were highlighted by a berth in the NCAA Division II Tournament and a number 12 ranking in the national poll.

In 17 seasons at the collegiate level, Dr. Sinn has compiled a record of 308-181 with 15 winning seasons. He has led his teams to 18 or more victories ten times, including six seasons of 20 or more wins.

Prior to coming to USI, Dr. Sinn spent nine years at Northwest Missouri State University where he compiled a 165-90 record. He averaged more wins per season (18.3) than any coach in the school's history. While at Northwest, he led the Bearcats back into the national scene for the first time in 40 years.

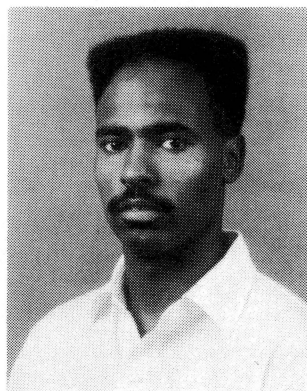
Dr. Sinn led the Bearcats to national rankings eight of his nine seasons and was named the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association Coach of the Year and Kodak NABC District Coach of the Year in the 1986-87 season.

Dr. Sinn began his career as a head coach at Bethel College in McKenzie, Tenn. He compiled the school's highest winning percentage with a 107-68 record and his teams were ranked in the top 20 of the NAIA national poll in four of his six seasons. He received the district Coach of the Year award in three of his six seasons there.

A native of Indiana, Dr. Sinn earned the bachelor (with distinction), master (with honors), and doctorate degrees at Indiana University. Dr. Sinn stresses the importance of education in athletics. Nearly 90 percent of his seniors have earned degrees.

While at Indiana, he was a graduate assistant to Indiana University's Bob Knight in the 1972-73 season when Indiana made it to the Final Four in St. Louis (UCLA, Memphis State and Providence).

Prior to coaching at the collegiate level, Dr. Sinn coached Indiana high school basketball for nine years.

Vic Coleman**

Vic Coleman enters his third season as assistant coach of the USI basketball team.

Coleman joined the USI staff after a six-year association with Dr. Sinn at Northwest Missouri. Coleman played for four years at Northwest and was the graduate assistant for one year and the number one assistant for a year, all under Dr. Sinn.

Coleman, a native of Danville, Va., is known for his recruiting ability. He likes to go one-on-one with potential recruits and share his playing and coaching experience with them.

The 28-year-old finished his four-year (1980-84) playing career as the Bearcats leading scorer (1795 points) and playmaker (467 assists). He was a two-time All-Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) first team (1982-83 and 1983-84) after leading the Bearcats in scoring both of those seasons, and he earned honorable mention All-American honors in 1984.

Coleman was a tenth-round draft selection of the then Kansas City Kings in the summer of 1984 and was the last player cut from the rookie camp. He was the starting point-guard with the Continental Basketball Association (CBA) Kansas City Sizzlers during the 1985-86 season.

University of Southern Indiana 1990-91 Men's Basketball Outlook

In the 1989-90 season, the University of Southern Indiana Screaming Eagles soared into the top 20 for the fifth time in the school's history and into the NCAA Playoffs for the sixth time.

The Eagles turned around a 15-13 record and a seventh place finish in the Great Lakes Valley Conference and finished 21-10 overall and in second place in the GLVC with a 13-5 record. The Eagles were one of only two teams to defeat the Division II national champions, Kentucky Wesleyan College.

Key to the successful '89-90 season was the play of senior guards Chris Johnson and Robin Clark. Johnson led the team in scoring with 15 points per game and 4.1 assists a game. Clark was second in scoring with 14 ppg and was ranked among the leaders in the nation in three-point field goal percentage. Both players were named to the second team All-GLVC and second team All-Great Lakes Region.

In 1990-91, the Eagles will strive to maintain the degree of excellence they achieved last season. USI will open the season at home with the Kenny Kent Toyota Classic which will feature Indiana University-Purdue University Indianapolis, a NAIA National Tournament contender last season.

On the road, the Eagles will face some of the toughest opponents of the year. They will travel to Washington, D.C., to play the Hoyas of Georgetown University, a game which will reunite the Mutombo brothers, Ilo of USI and Dikembe of GU.

The next Saturday, the Eagles will travel to Madison, Wis., and take on the Badgers of the University of Wisconsin.

USI then will come home to face Hanover College before preparing for the USI/Executive Inn National Shootout, the premier Division II tournament in the country. This year the shootout will feature four teams which competed in the NCAA playoffs last season including NCAA Division II defending champion, KWC.

In January, the Eagles then will start the GLVC schedule in which they face KWC two more times; along with Ashland, who was runner-up to KWC in the Great Lakes Regional; and Indiana-Purdue Ft. Wayne, which hovered around the top 20 mark last season.

Head Coach Lionel Sinn says, "We have the best tournament in the country, with four ranked teams, including the defending national champions. With the Division I schools on the schedule, we will have a strong test to open the season, not to mention the conference schedule."

The strength of the USI team will be the returning front court with Dennis Humphrey, a 6-7 senior forward who averaged 11.3 ppg and 4.2 rpg; Ilo Mutomobo, a 6-10 senior center who averaged 12.9 ppg and 8.3 rpg; and defensive specialist Rick Stein, a 6-5 senior forward with 9.1 ppg and 4.2 rpg.

Also returning from last season in the reserve is Darryl Conaway, a 6-5 senior forward who averaged 5.2 ppg and 4.2 rpg and Gary Hrvol, 6-8 junior center forward/center with 4.5 ppg and 2.0 rpg off the bench last year.

A big addition to the USI's front line will be 6-9 sophomore forward/center Chris Bowles, who transferred to USI from Western Kentucky University. At Madisonville (Ky.) High School, he averaged 17 ppg and 12 rpg.

USI will be trying to fill the big shoes left by Johnson and Clark at the guard positions. The only returning guards with experience at USI are 6-3 senior John Schellenberg (4.0 ppg and 1.3 rpg last season) and 6-0 senior Geoff Gentil.

"Gentil has become a more confident player, but needs to become more aggressive. He and Schellenberg will get a good look as will a lot of people," said Sinn.

The key to the Eagles' success this season will be the eight newcomers and the way they blend with the veterans. USI has two redshirt guards, one juco transfer and four freshmen guards to add to its system.

The redshirts are Terone Johnson, a 6-5 junior guard/forward who averaged 19.0 ppg and 5.0 rpg at Brevard (Fla.) Junior College and 6-2 junior guard Robert Turnbow, who averaged 26.0 ppg and 5.0 rpg at Olive Harvey (Ill.) Junior College.

The one transfer from Montreat-Anderson (N.C.) Junior College is Ethan Smith, a 6-1 sophomore who averaged 13 ppg and 2.0 rpg.

The freshmen are the unknown quantities, having never played at the collegiate level. The Henderson County (Ky.) connection, 6-4 Lamont Brewer, who averaged 15 ppg and 7.0 rpg and 6-3 Bobby Leavell, who averaged 18 ppg and 7.0 rpg, bring their show to USI after leading Henderson County H.S. to Kentucky District finals last season.

They will be joined by 6-5 Jeff Doyle, who averaged 24 ppg and 10 rpg at Loogootee High School (Ind.) and 6-2 Craig Martin, who averaged 22 ppg and 4.0 rpg at North Harrison High School (New Salisbury, Ind.).

Sinn says, "The ingredients are there in quantity and quality. With coaching I hope to build a strong unit. The first objective is to find a good combination, and the second is defense.

"Defensively we are totally unproven. We will score with the best of them, but can we stop anybody from scoring? The new players are not seasoned veterans defensively and defense is the foundation on which you build. The key will be to mesh the veterans and the newcomers."



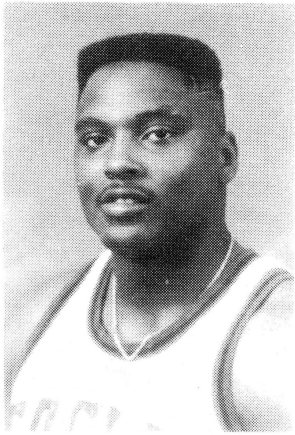

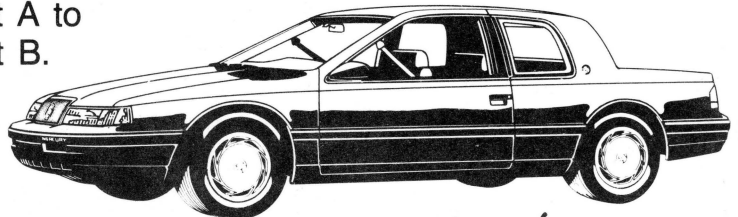

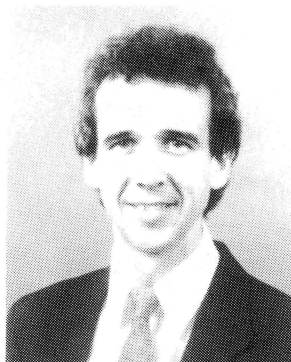
Cavallini, who is 8-47 in her career, joined the USI staff in the 1988-89 season after a successful season under coach Bob Foley at Providence College in Providence, R.I.

A 1984 graduate of Rice University, Cavallini was named to Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities. At Rice, she played basketball and volleyball, and was basketball team captain her senior year. In the summer of 1982, she participated in a four-game series against the Puerto Rican National Team.

Prior to her appointment at Providence, Cavallini served as assistant women's basketball coach at Siena College in Loudonville, N.Y. At Siena, Cavallini helped guide the Lady Indians to a 20-9 season as well as coaching the women's outdoor track team, which competed in the New York State Division III championship. She also served as aerobics coordinator for both men's and women's intercollegiate sports programs.

Cavallini also was assistant women's basketball coach and aerobics coordinator for the men's and women's teams at the University of Texas-San Antonio. In her two years at UTSA, the Roadrunners compiled a 36-19 record, which included a co-championship of the Oil Country Athletic Conference in 1984-85.

Well-versed in the areas of coaching, nutrition and conditioning, Cavallini has had articles published on these topics. Her article, "Basketball and Aerobic Conditioning" appeared in Athletic Journal. Another on this same subject was published in Scholastic Coach.

University of Southern Indiana 1990-91 Women's Basketball Outlook

"Starting from square one and working on the basics."

"What if...?"

"Finding the right combination!"

These are the thoughts crossing the mind of the University of Southern Indiana women's basketball coach Felicia Cavallini. The third-year head coach faces a major rebuilding task this season. Only one a full-time starter of three returning players who ended the season, plus, one player who was an injury redshirt last season, return as the nucleus of 1990-91 squad. The team finished 2-26 overall and 0-18 in the Great Lakes Valley Conference for tenth place last year.

The major task in front of Cavallini will be to replace USI's second all-time leading scorer, Shelly Scott, who led the team in scoring last season with 15.9 points per game and was second in rebounding with 7.4 per game. Also gone from last year's team is the assist leader Monica Lutchka, who averaged 3.5 assists and 6.2 ppg last season.

With the departure of starters Scott, Lutchka, and Missy Inman, who was the third leading scorer on the team last season (9.5 ppg), Cavallini must replace 50 percent of the team's offense and 40 percent of the rebounding.

"This season, we're starting over, but we have the necessary tools to build a winning program and tradition," said Cavallini. "Major changes were to improve the program and we now have players who are highly motivated, enjoy the game and understand my expectations."

The foundation on which to start is last year's second leading scorer, 6-0 junior center Thea Gould. After playing the first part of the season with a broken left wrist, Gould finished the season averaging 12.4 ppg and led the team with 8.3 rpg.

Cavallini says, "With the young team we have this season we will be slightly handicapped, so we will be looking to Gould and the seniors for leadership. I really expect Thea to have the best season of her career."

One problem which haunted Gould last season was foul trouble (fouling out 10 contests), but USI has a capable substitute behind Gould in 6-0 senior Amy McCord. McCord made her return to the squad after sitting out the 1988-89 season and averaged 6.2 ppg and 3.7 rpg last season.

While McCord made her return to the front-court last year, 5-8 sophomore Missy Burkhardt will try and regain her 1988-89 form after having a season-ending knee injury in 89-90. As a freshman, Burkhardt averaged 7.2 ppg and 5.0 rpg at the forward position.

At the guard position, the only returning player is part-time starter Jo Corbett, a 5-3 senior. Corbett, who played in all 28 games for the first time in her career, averaged 5.6 ppg and 1.5 assists per.

Joining the veterans will be eight newcomers who will not have the experience needed, but will give the team something it did not have last season, depth.

Leading the way for five new guards is freshman Heidi Bullock, a 5-6 guard who averaged 30 ppg and 7.0 rpg for Barr-Reeve High School in Cannelburg, Ind. Also coming in at the guard position is 5-8 Heather Bradford of Washington, Ind., 5-6

Laura Perek of Burr-Ridge, Ill., and 5-6 Sharie Sweet of Indianapolis, Ind.

The Lady Eagles have one new guard with some collegiate experience in 5-1 sophomore guard Angie Spaulding. Spaulding transferred from Marian College in Indianapolis, Ind., where she averaged 2.0 ppg and 1.0 rpg.

In the front court, joining Gould, McCord, and Burkhardt, will be three more freshmen. Adding depth to the inside positions, which is something the Lady Eagles lacked last year, will be 5-11 center Kim Bechtel from Washington, Ind., 6-2 center Jamie Demmon from Crown Point, Ind., and 5-11 Kathy Lauck from Indianapolis, Ind.

"We will be exciting to watch this season. We have five big players who can move well, so we won't have the slow pace of prior years, but an up-tempo style game," said Cavallini.

With the combination of old and new players, Coach Cavallini's goal is to improve on last year's record. "I'm hopeful that we will do better than a year ago. This season we have team unity and chemistry with all of the players getting along and behind the program," said Cavallini.

"We start the season with two excellent tournaments on the road (Quincy (Ill.) Tournament, November 16-17 and St. Mary's (Tx.) Tournament, November 24-25), which will test our youth right away."

The Lady Eagles will also have to face GLVC opponents Bellarmine College, which was the NCAA Division II South Atlantic Regional champion; St. Joseph's College, which was the NCAA Division II Great Lakes Regional runner-up; and Indiana-Purdue Ft. Wayne, which also participated in the NCAA tournament.

Cavallini said, "The key is for our players to stay healthy and keep a good attitude and we will be able to upset a few teams."
