

APPOINTED TO GOVERNOR'S COMMITTEE

Barbara J. Marting, Associate Professor of Business, has been appointed to the seven-member Governor's Commission on the Status of Women of the State of Indiana. Appointed by Governor Otis R. Bowen, Dr. Marting will serve on the commission as City and County Liason through 1976. She is the only member of the committee who resides south of Indianapolis.

The Governor's Commission on the Status of Women defined as priority of the Commission that women have full opportunity to serve in every capacity as citizens of the state of Indiana, as equal participants in the economy, in politics, and in government, in education, in social development, in the system of justice, and in all facets of life.

The Commission will make every effort to assure equal rights for women and minorities and to develop affirmative action programs to involve them at every level of employment, decision-making and contracts for services, to protect and to promote women's interests.
