6. Parking of Vehicles inside the Academic Building Arc.

Because of the campus disorders and especially the bombings that have been taking place in the United States, it is felt that the following

action must be taken to enable the Security Department to more closely supervise the coming and going of campus traffic.

Effective September 14, 1970, all University employees and students will park their motor vehicles in the parking lot on the perimeter of the academic arc of buildings. This means that employees will no longer be permitted to park in the area of the power plant and the parking regulations regarding the service road and the dock area of the classroom building will be strictly enforced. Vehicles illegally parked will be ticketed and an attempt will be made to contact the owners to move their vehicles; and if this is not possible, the vehicle will be towed away.

Whenever it is necessary for employees to use these facilities while loading or unloading, the employee should contact the Security Department.

We realize this will create some inconvenience, but it is felt that this action is necessary at this time.

7. Indiana Student Financial Aid

The Indiana Student Financial Aid Association has as a part of its program the dissemination of pertinent financial aid information to high school juniors, seniors, and their parents.

A series of these informative meetings are now being scheduled by Mr. Sander, and are to be held during October in a number of area high schools.

The various items of financial aids available at our University and how to apply for them are explained. Use of the Parents' Confidential Statement is emphasized.

9. Housing for Students

In Mrs. Barton's absence from the campus, September 15, 16 and 17, housing for students will be handled by Mr. Sander's office.

10. Fall Registration - September 15-16

Registration for fall semester is scheduled for September 15 and 16, and classes begin on September 17 for the 1970-71 academic year. Faculty advisors will be on campus to aid students in planning schedules.

Students will register at the time which corresponds to the first letter of their last name. Pre-advised students will register from 8:00 a. m. until 6:00 p. m. on September 15, and from 8:00 a. m. until 12:00 noon on September 16. Packets for pre-advised students will not be held past 12:00 noon on September 16. All other students will register on September 16, from 1:00 p. m. until 5:00 p. m.

11. ISUE Employees Enrolling in Classes

With the approval of the Department Head and the Business Manager, an employee may be given sufficient time from duties to attend day classes to a maximum of three semester hours per semester. Time taken from work would be made up at scheduled times in agreement with the Department Head and the Personnel Department. Courses taken should be:

- (a) to improve the competence of the person in his position and/or
- (b) required for the degree which the person is seeking.

Anyone desiring to seek approval to take day classes should see Mrs. Patterson in Personnel for the proper procedure.
