**"TOP GIRLS" OPENS THURSDAY AT THE PLAYHOUSE.** The next presentation by the Indiana State University Evansville Theatre group will be Caryl Churchill's "Top Girls" -- a critique on women that is at times funny, at times fierce, but never laid back nor easy. The author has been called a "theatrical idol smasher" by reviewers.

Laura Hubbell is directing the ISUE production. Curtain time is 8 p.m. on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, April 18-19-20 and 25-26-27 at the ISUE Playhouse, Igleheart and Barker avenues. Tickets are \$4 for the public and \$3 for students, faculty, and staff at the university; group rates also are available.
