2005 USI BASEBALL SEASON OUTLOOK

NCAA II Tournament: 1979, 1983, 1989, 1992, 1993, 1994

Depth and experience are on tap in 2005 and should enable the University of Southern Indiana baseball team to make a run at the upper division of the GLVC.

USI Head Coach Mike Goedde starts the 2005 campaign with 20 returning players – seven position players, 11 pitchers, and two utility players – including a pair of All-GLVC performers. The Eagles all-time winningest coach, who begins the season with a record of 304-265 (.534) in 11 seasons, also has 11 new players this spring.

THE RETURNING PLAYERS

The Screaming Eagles return a pair of All-GLVC performers – senior outfielder **Noah Wetzel** and senior utility player **Matt Keener** – to lead them in 2005. The pair were one-two on the team in eight of the 11 offensive categories at the plate and ranked among the top hitters in the GLVC.

Wetzel led the Eagles and ranked eighth in the GLVC with a .368 batting average, rotating between the lead-off and

three hole in the line-up. The two-time All-GLVC centerfielder also led the team with a .420 on-base percentage, 74 hits, and 41 runs scored.

Keener, who was the USI clean-up hitter and saw action as a pitcher, first baseman, and outfielder last year, led the team with 47 RBIs, 14 doubles, six triples, and eight home runs. His eight home runs tied for fourth in the GLVC. He was second in triples in the league.

Wetzel and Keener will be rejoined in the outfield by senior **Trevor Kelly**. Kelly, who also will see time behind the plate in 2005, played in 53 games for the Eagles and hit .282 with 34 runs scored and 16 RBIs.

The Eagles also are experienced in the middle infield with the return of senior second baseman **Bryan Davis** and senior shortstop **Corey Goers**. Davis, who shared the lead-off duties with Wetzel last year, hit .266 with 34 runs scored and 18 RBIs. Goers, a three-year starter at shortstop, hit a career-high .247, 30 points over his career average, and had a career-best 28 RBIs in 55 games.

The starting positions at the corners of the infield will be up for grabs in 2005. Returning are part-time starters **Jared Tekulve**, a senior, and **Brent Perry**, a junior. Tekulve, who saw action at second base, third base, and leftfield in his 39 appearances a year ago, hit .226 with 10 RBIs, while Perry hit .240 with 15 RBIs in 36 games at third base.

The lone returner at first base is junior infielder **Derik Hutton**. Hutton played in 24 games as a sophomore and hit .217 in spot action.

Behind the plate, the Eagles have three returning catchers in Kelly, senior **Andy Rock**, and sophomore **Jed Davis**. Rock, who hit .271 with seven RBIs, and Davis, who hit .167 in seven games, saw action mainly as the designated hitters in 2004.

The mound is where the Eagles bring back the most experience and depth. USI returns five starters and three hurlers out of the bullpen for 2005.

Senior right-hander **Andy Rumpler** is USI's leading hurler. Rumpler finished 2004 with a team-high 7-3 record by winning six of his final seven starts and posted a team-best 3.25 ERA in 61 innings of work. He also was second on the team with 28 strike outs.

Rumpler was followed in the rotation by junior right-hander **Mike Watson**. Watson had a 3.86 ERA and was second to Rumpler with a 4-2 record. He also held opposing hitters to a team-low .256 batting among the starters.

The Eagles also will look for bigger contributions from Keener, who led the team in ERA in 2003; sophomore right-hander **Adam Summers**; and senior right-hander **Jaе Fadde**. Keener had an up-and-down season, finishing 1-4 in nine starts, while Summers was 3-5 with a 3.68 ERA and Fadde posted a 3-4 record and a 5.40 ERA. *continued...*

USI is led out of the bullpen by junior right-hander **Matt Goans**, who had a team-best six saves and a 3.43 ERA in 24 games. Goans was set up by sophomore **Aaron Clark**, who was 2-2 with three saves and a 4.71 ERA in 19 appearances.

In addition to Goans and Clark, junior left-hander **Nathan Arnold**, junior right-handers **Dustin Jourdan** and **Pat Morgan**, and sophomore right-hander **Adam Vetter** will be looked to for larger contributions in 2005. Arnold, the only returning left-hander, made 16 appearances in 2005 and had a save. Jourdan made seven appearances in 2004, while Vetter was slowed to just nine appearances due to injury.

TRANSFERS

Goedde adds five players from the junior college ranks to the veteran team.

In the field, USI has supplemented its depth with juniors **Chris Turner**, a first baseman/catcher, as well as sophomores **Justin Wolfe**, an outfielder, and **Hunter Slade**, an outfielder.

Turner helped Lassen Community College to the Golden Valley Conference Championship by hitting .351 with eight doubles and 20 RBIs last spring. Slade played for DePauw University in 2004 where he hit .261 with a pair of home runs in 30 games, while Wolfe transferred to USI from the University of Toledo.

On the mound, junior right-hander **Nathan Siedler** hopes to contribute right away. Siedler had a career 3.67 ERA at Shawnee College, holding opposing hitters to a .235 batting average.

FRESHMEN

Seven freshmen – three position players and four pitchers – will enter their first season of collegiate action in 2005.

Joining the infield ranks are catcher **Kyle Asay**, infielder **Sam Shahine**, and infielder **Josh Malone**. Shahine hit .400 as a junior and a senior and played all four infield positions at West Lafayette High School.

On the mound, USI adds right-handers **Jeremy Kehrt**, **Dan Kissel**, **Matt Nichols**, and **Matt Halbig**. Kehrt was 8-2 as a senior with a 3.09 ERA, including 88 strikeouts in 56.2 innings at Plainfield High School. Nichols was 3-1 as a senior at Castle High School, while Halbig had a 1.73 ERA in his final season at Mater Dei High School.

Head Baseball Coach

Nobody has won more baseball games at the University of Southern Indiana than Head Coach Mike Goedde. He became USI's all-time winningest coach with the Screaming Eagles' 11-6 victory over Indiana University Southeast on April 3, 2001, and has a career record of 304-266 (.533).

Entering his 12th season in 2005, Goedde will field 23 returning players from a squad that was 23-33 in 2004. The Eagles were 17-23 in the first ever 40-game GLVC schedule.

Goedde guided the Eagles back to the GLVC Tournament in 2001 with a second place finish in the South Division at 15-12. USI finished 28-29 overall and placed fourth in the league's post-season tournament, falling in 12 innings to the eventual NCAA II regional champion.

The Evansville, Indiana, native steered the Eagles on a course to a 30-win season in 1999, completing the year at 34-19 overall, 17-10 in the GLVC. USI also led the conference in hitting (.319) with wood bats and lowered the ERA to a respectable 4.59.

In 1998, he completed his fifth season with a 26-19 overall record, 9-13 GLVC. His team was one of the most offensive-minded in USI history, setting the school record for batting average for the second straight season and boasting three .400 hitters.

During the 1997 campaign, Goedde steered the Eagles to a 30-16 overall record and a 16-9 conference mark, missing the league divisional playoffs by a half game. At the conclusion of the season, he had led the Eagles to the 30-win mark for the second time in six seasons, and back into the regional races. He successfully led the 1996 team to a 27-22 overall record, 14-12 in the GLVC, while leading the 1995 team to a 29-23 record and a 10-8 GLVC record.

In his first season, he led the Eagles to a 36-19 record and berths in the GLVC and NCAA Division II Central Region tournaments.

Prior to coming to USI, Goedde was an assistant coach at the University of Evansville (UE), under Head Coach Jim Brownlee, from 1986-1988 and 1990-1993.

While Goedde was at UE, the baseball team was the Midwestern Collegiate Conference champion in 1988 and 1990. In 1988, the pitching staff had the second best ERA (2.99) in the country. The staff featured former major league All-Star Andy Benes.

After being drafted by the Cincinnati Reds in the fourth round of the 1983 draft, Goedde spent three seasons in the Reds' farm system (1983-1985). In 1989, Goedde was a pitching instructor with the Reds' organization in the Pioneer League in Billings, Montana.

Goedde graduated from UE with a degree in sports administration, and from Evansville Mater Dei High School. Goedde and his wife Soozie live in Evansville with her children Julie, Brian, and Kyle.

In addition to his duties as baseball coach, Goedde also is a physical education instructor at USI.

Assistant Coach Chris Barney returns for his 12th season at USI as the hitting instructor, working with the infielders and outfielders, and coaching third base. The Eagles finished first in the GLVC in 1999 with a .319 team batting average while using wood bats.

He joined Head Coach Mike Goedde's staff in 1993-94 after spending the 1992-93 year at Tusculum College in Greenville, Tennessee. Prior to working at Tusculum, Coach Barney spent three-and-a-half years (1989-92) with Tennessee Wesleyan College as an assistant coach. At both schools, he was responsible for daily practices, field maintenance, and fund-raising projects.

While Barney was the head coach of the Quincy Gems of the Central Illinois Collegiate League, his teams won the CICL Tournament Championship twice (1996 and 1998), the Western Division twice (1998 and 1999), and had the best overall record in the CICL in 1998 at 40-10.

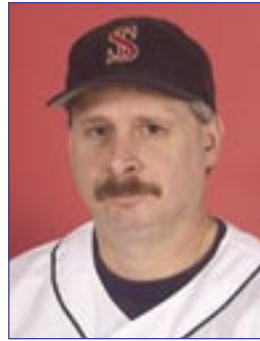
Barney took over the CICL's Springfield Rifles in 2001, helping them capture a share of the Western Division Championship and a tie for the league's best record at 28-20 in 2002. In eight seasons, he has a CICL record of 217-159 (.577).

In 2004, Barney will become the field manager of the CICL's new franchise, the Indiana Cardinals. The Cardinals are located in Huntingburg, Indiana.

A 1992 graduate of Tennessee Wesleyan with a degree in business administration, Barney has worked summer baseball camps in Florida, Tennessee, Indiana, and Michigan. In 1995, he managed the Chet Lemon Juice 14-year-old team that went on to the National AAU Tournament held in Minneapolis, Minnesota, and finished fifth.

**Dave Sensenbrenner,

Dave Sensenbrenner joined the USI coaching staff for 2003-04, assisting Head Coach Mike Goedde in all facets of the team with an emphasis on pitching.

Sensenbrenner joins the USI staff after nine seasons as the head coach at Castle High School in Newburgh, Indiana. He compiled a record of 175-80 (.686) during his tenure.

An alumnus of the Screaming Eagles' baseball program, Sensenbrenner's 1.36 ERA in 1979 remains a USI single-season record. During his four-year career with the Eagles, he had a career record of 14-15 with a 3.69 ERA in 202.2 innings pitched. He also posted 14 complete games and three shutouts.

Following his collegiate career, Sensenbrenner moved on to the professional ranks and reached triple-A with the San Francisco Giants.

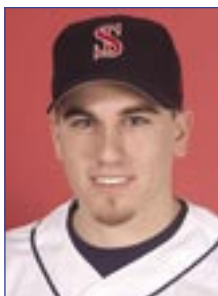

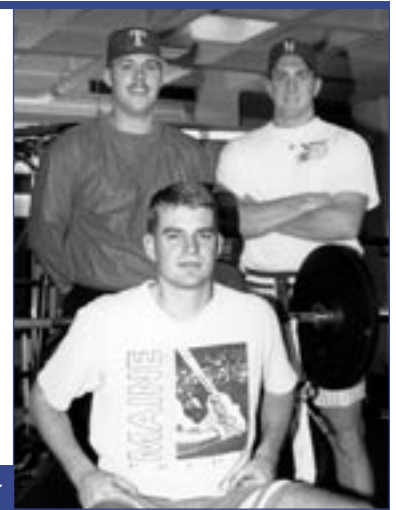
