RAPE AWARENESS SEMINAR AT ISUE NOVEMBER 18. A Rape Awareness Seminar will be held at ISUE Tuesday, November 18, from 10:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. in UC350. The seminar is sponsored by Citizens Against Rape in Evansville (CARE), and ISUE offices of Campus Ministry, Health Services, and Student Affairs. The seminar will feature five main speakers from various organizations which deal with rape victims.

Nancy Hankins, a Vanderburgh County deputy prosecutor, will talk about the legal process a rape victim can follow. Kay Koob, a vice president at Keller-Crescent, will show the file "Violence Against Women in the Media". Susan Wilke, a social worker at Deaconess Hospital and member of CARE, will also show a film about rape. An emergency room nurse, June Willis, will explain emergency medical treatment available at area hospitals. Ada Meyer, representing the Evansville Police Department, will discuss how police deal with rape victims.
