MID-STATES ART EXHIBITION IN LIBRARY, MARCH 7-MARCH 28

The Evansville Museum Mid-States Traveling Art Exhibition will be on display in the main reading room of the Indiana State University, Evansville library from March 7 through March 28.

This exhibition includes representatives from the entire Mid-States Art Exhibition that was on display at the Evansville Museum in December, 1971.

An entry by an ISUE senior art student, Terry Southerland, will be part of the exhibition. His sculpture "Beech-Nut Gum" won recognition in the display at the Evansville Museum.

ISUE students and faculty are encouraged to view the traveling art exhibition in the library. This is the first exhibition of its kind to be on the Evansville Campus. The exhibition is sponsored by the ISUE Arts Commission.

SCIENCE SYMPOSIUM ON EVANSVILLE CAMPUS

The Indiana-Kentucky Border Section of the American Chemical Society is sponsoring a Science Symposium for area high school students on March 11, 1972 at the Evansville Campus of ISU. The program which is to begin at 8:30 a.m., will cover modern chemical and biological instrumentation; drug metabolism and protein synthesis machine; industrial application of chemistry, especially in the field of plastics; synthetic organic chemistry; and environmental chemistry with emphasis on organic pollutants in our rivers. Dr. Howard E. Dunn, Assistant Professor of Chemistry at ISUE is the chairman of the 1972 Science Symposium.

Speakers for the Symposium are from Brescia College, General Electric Company, Mead Johnson, Environmental Protection Agency, and ISUE.

Over thirty laboratory demonstrations will be running continuously throughout the day. One of the highlights of the demonstrations will be a glass blowing demonstration. All demonstrations will be prepared and demonstrated by ISUE Science majors. Students from thirty-six area high schools have been invited to the Science Symposium.

ROOM REQUISITION PROCEDURES OUTLINED

The procedure for requesting rooms is being developed to facilitate the growing campus and its needs for room reservations. If an instructor wishes to request a room change for his class, or request an additional room for a class activity, he must contact his divisional chairman. The divisional chairman will then forward a Room Scheduling Request Form to the Assistant to the Registrar who will schedule a room.

Any off-campus organization wishing to schedule a room must contact the Assistant to the President. The Assistant to the President will forward the Room Scheduling Request Form to the Assistant to the Registrar and a room will be scheduled.

If a student organization wishes to reserve a room, they must contact the Dean of Students. The Dean of Students will forward a Room Scheduling Request Form to the Assistant to the Registrar who will schedule a room.

If a clerical staff member wishes to reserve a room, they must contact the Personnel Office. The Personnel Manager will forward a Room Scheduling Request Form to the Assistant to the Registrar and a room will be scheduled.

Any administrative staff member wishing to schedule a room, must contact the Dean of Academic and Student Services. The Dean will forward a Room Scheduling Request Form to the Assistant to the Registrar and a room will be scheduled.

All Room Scheduling Request Forms must be forwarded to the Registrar's Office seven days prior to the planned event. The scheduled room will be telephoned back to the originator the same day the request is received. The Room Scheduling Request Forms will be available in the Divisional Chairman's Offices for Faculty, in the Dean of Student's Office for students, in the President's Office for off-campus groups, in the Personnel Office for clerical staff, and in the Dean of Academic and Student Services for Administrative staff.
