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SPORTS TICKETS, PASSES

Season tickets and employee passes are available in the Athletic Department for fall and winter sports. The employee pass provides free admission to soccer and volleyball games and to women's basketball games not played in tandem with the men's team.

The soccer Eagles enter NCAA Division I this year and will play eight games at Strassweg Field. Their season opens September 7; the first home game will be September 16. The adult season ticket is \$25; non-USI student, \$10. USI students with IDs enter free.

Men's basketball opens November 27 and will offer 18 home games -- 14 regular season games, nine of them double headers with the women's team, plus the Kenny Kent Classic and the USI/Executive Inn National Shootout. **October 1 is the deadline to get your season tickets and keep the seats you had last year.** Tickets are \$45 for chairback; \$30, bench; \$12.50, non-USI student. USI students with IDs enter free.

STIPENDS AVAILABLE. September 18 is the deadline for USI faculty members to enter competition for the 1993 National Endowment for the Humanities Summer Stipends program. The stipends provide support for faculty in the humanities to devote two months of full-time study and research to projects that contribute to scholarly knowledge, to conception and substance of individual courses, or to the public understanding of the humanities. The project may be part of a long-range endeavor; it does not have to be completed during the stipend tenure.

The NEH Travel to Collections program has merged with Summer Stipends, so applicants now apply for awards of \$4,000 for projects not requiring travel and \$4,750 for those requiring travel over a significant distance for research purposes.
