ALPHA OMEGA PSI MAJOR CONTRIBUTOR TO MUSCULAR DYSTROPHY CAMPAIGN

The Alpha Omega Psi Fraternity presented \$1,257.81 to the Jerry Lewis Muscular Dystrophy Association Telethon on September 2, 1974. This year's collection was approximately 10% more than last year, and again was one of the largest contributions in the tri-state area.

Last year their \$1,100 contribution made national news when it was announced on the national network on the Jerry Lewis Telethon. This year several universities across the country presented Mr. Lewis with contributions of \$10,000 to \$25,000. The Alpha Omega Psi Fraternity are hopeful that their contribution and its announcement on national network last year precipitated this year's contributions by other universities.
