5. Effective College Teaching

During the past few years the USOE has been sponsoring studies of college teaching at the University of Michigan. The most important results of the studies were in indicating that particular teaching styles are effective for a certain kind of student and ineffective for others; for example male instructors who are friendly and take a personal interest in their students are particularly effective with women students and with men who are high in need for affiliation. Male students who are low in need for affiliation do poorly with such teachers. Generally speaking a cooperative classroom atmosphere resulted in less tension and greater student satisfaction than one in which there was student competition with one another.

Studies have also demonstrated six distinct aspects of teaching that clearly differentiate different kinds of teachers. These have been labelled: Skill; Difficulty; Rapport (Warmth); Group Interaction; Feedback; Structure.

Notre Dame University has commissioned Miss Ramona Hinton, our ISUE studio artist, for one of her most recent and ambitious peices of sculpture for their permanent collection.

This piece is to be installed in the Continuing Education Center on the Notre Dame University Campus. The sculpture submitted by Miss Hinton is a ceramic sculpture space divider, size: 6 feet high by 4 feet wide with a perpendicular versal; 3 feet across by six feet high. Incorporation of ship rope and red-wood not only enhance the ceramic piece but makes it a thing unique.
