




Message from Dr. David Rice, *President*

Welcome to the University of Southern Indiana and Screaming Eagles basketball. The basketball season is anxiously awaited each year because of its promise for excitement. Our men's and women's athletic program provides the opportunity for our student athletes to demonstrate their considerable skills in intercollegiate competition while giving those of us who are spectators limitless opportunities for entertainment and fellowship. The games allow students, alumni, faculty, and friends of the University another way to show our pride in our University as well as in our student athletes who so ably represent it.

Thank you for the support you give the University and its athletic program, but most importantly, to its student athletes whose achievements we cheer in and out of the classroom.

About the University

The University of Southern Indiana became Indiana's sixth state university on July 1, 1985, after twenty years as a regional campus. It is a comphrehensive university excelling in undergraduate instruction in more than sixty academic majors. USI confers master's degrees in industrial management, secondary education and liberal arts, and offers other graduate programs in cooperation with other universities. The University of Southern Indiana also offers continuing education courses, business and professional seminars, and community service programs through its Office of Continuing Education and Extended Services.

This fall, entering its 25th year of service, the University's enrollment reached 5,713 students. It expects to serve an additional 6,000 people in noncredit programs during the academic year. The University's enrollment has grown dramatically in the last five years and reflects greater numbers of students from the southern Indiana region.

When the University first opened its doors on September 15, 1965, there were 412 students who attended classes in temporary quarters in the Centennial School Building. The present campus, located in the 1400-acre Mid-America University Center, was developed according to a master plan and includes five major structures. The Science Center and Administration Building was opened in 1969, followed by the Library in 1971, the University Center in 1974, the Technology Center in 1975, and the Physical Activities Center in 1980. The Physical Activities Center, known as the PAC, houses the PAC Arena, the home court for USI athletic events. The Robert D. Orr Center, a new \$7.8 million classroom building, will open in January.

The University of Southern Indiana is governed by a nine-member Board of Trustees appointed by the Governor of Indiana. Members of the Board are Mr. Joseph E. O'Daniel, chairman, of Evansville; Mr. William E. Brooks, Jr., vice chairman, of Vincennes; Mrs. Carole D. Rust, vice chairman, of Mt. Vernon; Dr. Percy Clark, Jr., secretary, of Indianapolis; Mr. Robert M. Boyer of Terre Haute; Mr. Bruce Baker of Boonville; Dr. John J Pruis of Muncie; Mr. Brad A. Schepers of Celestine; and Dr. George B. Weathersby of Indianapolis.

The University is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools for programs through the master's level, and by other accrediting agencies for programs in allied health, education, engineering technology, and nursing.








The Physical Activities Center as it stands today.

THE PHYSICAL ACTIVITIES CENTER: HOME OF THE SCREAMING EAGLES

The Physical Activities Center (PAC), home of Screaming Eagles basketball, was built and opened in 1980. The building, constructed at a cost of \$4.4 million, originally was called the Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building (HPER). The building accommodates all physical education classes, intramural activities, student recreation, and provides an on-campus arena for USI basketball.




The Physical Activities Center opened to the public October 3, 1980.

Contained in the PAC is a multipurpose activity area, a gymnastics and dance module, an aquatics area, physical therapy and weight training rooms, four general classrooms, men's and women's locker rooms, and offices for educational and athletic personnel.

The multipurpose activity area is the most versatile section of the structure. It can support several activities simultaneously when the floor-to-ceiling curtains separate it into three teaching modules. Without the curtains, it can accommodate activities of a larger scope. It houses indoor intramural activities as well.

The gymnastics and dance module, containing a wide array of equipment, overlooks the multipurpose activity area and complements the other teaching unit. A 25-meter swimming pool with one- and three-meter diving boards is located in the aquatics area, which is enclosed for year-round use. The weight training and physical therapy rooms are important support components for all activities in the building.

For spectator athletic events and public forums in the multipurpose area, chairback and bleacher seating can be moved into place on sides of the room. These spectator capabilities were made possible through generous donations from the businesses and individuals in the Southwestern Indiana community. More than \$300,000 was raised by the USI Foundation in the Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building Fund Drive.



The PAC is home to 10 intercollegiate teams.

In addition to regularly scheduled credit and noncredit classes, health maintenance and open recreation periods are available so as many persons as possible may benefit from participating in lifetime physical activity. Information on use of the building is available by calling the PAC counter at 464-1945.

The PAC also houses special events for USI such as concerts, convocations, commencements and other activities which require large floor areas and spectator capabilities.

HEAD COACH DR. LIONEL SINN

Dr. Lionel Sinn will enter his second season as head coach of the Screaming Eagles after leading the team to a 15-13 record last season and the team's 11th winning season in 13 years. The 1988-89 accomplishments were highlighted by three victories over teams ranked as high as seventh in the national polls.

In 16 seasons at the collegiate level, Sinn has compiled a record of 287-171 with 14 winning seasons. He has led his teams to 17 or more victories ten times, including five seasons of 20 or more wins.

Prior to coming to USI, Sinn spent nine years at Northwest Missouri State University where he compiled a 165-90 record. He averaged more wins per season (18.3) than any coach in the school's history. While at Northwest, he led the Bearcats back into the national scene for the first time in 40 years.

Sinn led the Bearcats to national rankings eight of his nine seasons and was named the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association Coach of the Year and Kodak NABC District Coach of the Year in the 1986-87 season. Sinn began his career as a head coach at Bethel College in McKenzie, Tenn. He compiled the school's highest winning percentage with a 107-68 record and his teams were ranked in the top 20 of the NAIA national poll in four of his six seasons. He received the district Coach of the Year award in three of his six seasons there.

A native of Indiana, Sinn earned a bachelor's (with distinction), master's (with honors) and a doctoral degree at Indiana University. Sinn stresses the importance of education in athletics. Nearly 90 percent of his seniors have earned degrees.

While at Indiana, he was a graduate assistant to Indiana University's Bob Knight in the 1972-73 season when Indiana made it to the Final Four in St. Louis (UCLA, Memphis State and Providence).

Prior to coaching at the collegiate level, Sinn coached Indiana high school basketball for nine years.

ASSISTANT COACH VIC COLEMAN


Vic Coleman enters his second season as assistant coach of the USI basketball team.

Coleman joined the USI staff after a six-year association with Coach Sinn at Northwest Missouri. Coleman played for four years at Northwest and was the graduate assistant for one year and the number one assistant for a year, all under Coach Sinn.


Coleman, a native of Danville, Va., is known for his recruiting ability. He likes to go one-on-one with potential recruits and share his playing and coaching experience with them.

The 27-year-old finished his four-year (1980-84) playing career as the Bearcats leading scorer (1795 points) and playmaker (467 assists). He was a two-time All-Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) first team (1982-83 and 1983-84) selection, after leading the Bearcats in scoring both of those seasons, and he earned honorable mention All-American honors in 1984.

Coleman was a tenth-round draft selection of the then Kansas City Kings in the summer of 1984 and was the last player cut from the rookie camp. He was the starting point-guard with the Continental Basketball Association (CBA) Kansas City Sizzlers during the 1985-86 season.

The Screaming Eagles 1989-90 Outlook

The USI Screaming Eagles have been soaring high in the eighties with seven winning seasons of 15 or more wins each year, four Great Lakes Valley Championships and an invitation to the NCAA Division II tournament three times.

Despite a 6-10 conference record, the Eagles finished with a 15-13 mark, 1988-89. The highlights of the season included two wins over Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, who was ranked as high as seventh in the nation and a late season win over Bellarmine who was ranked seventh at the time

Head Coach Dr. Lionel Sinn enters the 1989-90 season and his second at USI with a very veteran and experienced team. The Eagles graduated only two seniors last season and return 11 players (ten letter winners) who received good amounts of playing time and were starters sometime in the season.

Leading the way for the Eagles will be junior center, **Ilo Mutombo**, who averaged 11.9 points and 8.1 rebounds a game. Mutombo, an All-America candidate, led the Eagles seven times in scoring and 13 times in rebounding, including 13 rebounds against Kentucky State and Missouri Baptist College. He also set a school record hitting 62.6 percent of his field goals (137/219).

"Mutombo's improvement over the last months and eight games of the season was tremendous," said Sinn. "He has turned into a smoother post player and is no longer mechanical or has to think about what he has to do."

Assistant Coach Vic Coleman said, "Mutombo has not had a lot of the things the other players have had and feels he has to work hard to get them. He has a great work attitude which is a good example for the other players to follow."

Another key to a successful season for the Eagles will be the play of the guards. Returning from last season will be seniors **Chris Johnson**, who led the team in scoring with 13.6 points a game, and **Robin Clark**, who holds the school career record for three-point shooting.

Sinn said, "Johnson should feel more at ease this season because he knows the offense. Last year he felt a little awkward running the new offense."

Behind Johnson and Clark, the Eagles have depth with the return of **John Schellenberg**, a junior who stepped in and started when Johnson and Clark were out with injuries. He averaged 5.8 points and 2.1 assists a game. Sinn said, "I expect Schellenberg to push Johnson and Clark. He really played well in the half-dozen starts when the starters were out with injuries. They all have experience and consistently play well."

Geoff Gentil, a junior will return for his third season and stabilize the guard depth on the bench. Coleman said, "Gentil will really help us out by giving us valuable minutes off the bench and giving people a rest."

The key to the Eagles' offense this year will be balance. Sinn said, "Mutombo is a force inside and people will have to stop him. We have to utilize our size inside to score and then establish the balance of inside and outside scoring."

To help Mutombo on the inside will be **Darryl Conaway**, a sophomore forward who averaged 6.4 points and 4.9 rebounds a game, junior forward **Dennis Humphrey**, who averaged 7.1 points and four rebounds, and **Tremelle King**, who averaged 3.7 points and 2.1 rebounds.


Sinn feels they will be pushed for the final starting spots by redshirt sophomore **Gary Hrvol**, a 6'8' forward/center who was on the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association All-Freshmen team in 1988, and **Rick Stein**, a forward who transferred from Parkland Junior College (III.).

Kip Brownfield, a senior guard/forward who averaged 4.4 points and 2.3 rebounds a game, will add versatility to the team as a shooting guard or as a small forward inside.

The outlook for USI this season looks good as the Eagles try to regain a position in the upper division of the GLVC. Sinn said, "The players are so much more positive this year. They know the style of play the coaches expect and have confidence in what they are doing."

"The players' experience will show because we will be more calm and confident on the floor, especially in the final three minutes of a game and they will be willing to take the big shot."

The Lady Screaming Eagles 1989-90 Outlook

In the 1988-89 season, the USI Lady Screaming Eagles showed just how tough they were last season.

The Lady Eagles broke nine team and 11 individual records and defeated St. Joseph's, ranked number four in the nation late in the season, but only finished with a 6-21 year.

Head Coach Felicia Cavallini said, "We were having a losing season and late in the season, the victory over St. Joseph's was a moral victory, which showed the team that they could beat a good team."

"It was a year to brag about because of the way the team hung together throughout the season and their confidence improved."

That was 1988-89. Now in her second season, Cavallini has confidence the Lady Eagles are ready to become a real force in the Great Lakes Valley Conference, with 11 players on scholarship and two walk-on players giving her the depth she did not have a year ago.

"We have added people at the guard position and have players who are interchangeable and have the ability to fill more than one role and let us do different things," said Cavallini.

Although the Lady Eagles have added depth, the team is still very young. Of the six newcomers, five are freshmen and one is a sophomore who saw only limited action at a junior college last season. Despite their inexperience, Cavallini is very optimistic.

"The incoming players are ahead of where the returning players were when they first came to USI," said Cavallini. "They came from strong high school programs and they've worked very hard since the start of school."

With the great proportion of young players, the upperclassmen (four juniors and one sophomore) will have to lead the club. Cavallini said, "The five upperclassmen have come back with a new sense of dedication and have a head start by knowing the system this season. They know how to win this season and their expectancy to win is higher than last year."

This season, as last year, a major part of the offensive production will fall on the shoulders of junior forward **Shelly Scott** an All-America candidate.

Last season, Scott led the Lady Eagles in 11 categories and broke school records, including points scored in a game (39) and one season (542), most field goals made in one season (193), free throws in one game (15) and one season (155), rebounds in one season (231), and scoring average in one season (20.4).

"Scott is a consistent scoring threat," said Cavallini. "She has the skill and will always be a factor in the game."

The other Shelly on the team, **Shelly Kramer**, junior guard, will compete for the point guard position. The third-year student has come into camp in the best condition and looks improved with more confidence over last season.

Returning players who could make an impact after working hard this summer include **Josette Corbett**, a junior guard; and **Missy Burkhardt**, a sophomore guard/forward.

"Corbett worked harder than anyone this summer. She is the most dedicated player on the team," said Cavallini. "She will surprise a lot of people in her improvement."

"Burkhardt will be moved outside to a small forward or off-guard. She played inside last season out of necessity and her versatility will help us do more things this year."

Another player to watch on the outside will be **Monica Lutchka**, a junior offguard. According to Cavallini, Lutchka could be a good outside shooter and is ambitious when she gets the ball.

The veterans will have to take the lead early to allow the freshmen a chance to learn the system. A key freshman, who could help the team right away, is **Amy Aronson**, a forward, who can take the ball to the basket. Sophomore transfer **Thea Gould** has an improved work ethic and could help give the Lady Eagles the added depth at the forward position.

The Lady Eagles are looking to break into the middle of the pack in the GLVC. Cavallini said, "The conference will be very tough and is one of the toughest in the nation. Any one of the teams could beat the other on a given night."
