**MADRIGAL DINNERS.** The Mid America Singers will present the annual Ye Old Madrigal Christmas Feastes on Thursday and Friday, December 2 and 3. This year the dinners will be held in the Tropical Pavillion of the Ramada Inn on Highway 41 North. The move away from campus is necessary because of the renovation of the Forum, which served as the Great Hall in previous performances.

The ticket price remains at \$12.50 per person; however, the Singers are inviting interested persons to be "Patrons of the Feaste". This is an opportunity to combine the enjoyment of an enriching and unique evening with a gift to the ongoing life and work of the production of the Feastes.

A patron's gift of \$50 or more entitles that person to two tickets for one of the productions plus the option of purchasing as many as four additional reserved seats at the special price of \$10 each. Each patron's name will be published in the program.

**UNITED WAY INFORMATION.** Some examples of what a weekly payroll deduction of \$5.00 means in terms of purchasing power over the course of one year are listed below.

- \* One fully-stocked trauma first aid kit for community aid stations.
- \* One hour of instruction per week for one year for a preschool handicapped child.
- \* Seven hours of infant stimulation therapy for developmentally-delayed infants.
- \* 20 sessions of group physical therapy for wheelchair-bound adults.
- \* A hot, nutritious lunch for a poor child at a day care center.
- \* Two months of personal hygiene care by a home health aide to an injured or disabled person.
- \* One home visit per week to an adolescent on house arrest.
- \* A one-day emergency food order to eight families.

PLEASE NOTE ROOM NUMBER AND NAME CHANGES. With the completion of the renovation of the Forum area of the Administration Building, the area will be known as the Forum Wing, Administration Building. The abbreviation for the area will be FWA. Rooms 126, 34, and 28 will be re-named Forum I, Forum II, and Forum III respectively; these will be abbreviated FWA-1, FWA-2, and FWA-3 in the class schedule. All other Forum classrooms and offices will be noted similarly in the class schedule.

The name of the Health, Physical Education, and Recreation Building is being abbreviated as the Physical Activity Center. Class Schedule abbreviations will be PAC, followed by the room number.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE. The SGA will sponsor its second annual Student Leadership Conference for Tri-State high school student council officers and advisors on Monday, November 15. More than 40 student leaders from area high schools attended last year's conference.

The purpose of the conference is to help high school student leaders develop and better understand their roles as leaders through a series of workshops presented by the ISUE Student Government Association. MINING SCHOLARSHIP. The Illinois Mining Institute has approved an annual scholarship award of \$750 to a mining student enrolled at ISUE. ISUE becomes the first Indiana institution of higher education to benefit from the Institute's scholarship program.

The other universities granting baccalaureate degrees in mining also receive \$750 scholarships. They are the University of Missouri at Rolla, University of Wisconsin at Platteville, and Southern Illinois University. Three community colleges in Illinois receive \$500 scholarships.

The first recipient of the mining scholarship will be named at ISUE Honors Day in the spring of 1983.
