Reinhold Marxhausen, professor of art at Concordia College in Seward, Nebraska and artist-in-residence for Bankers Life Nebraska, will be a special guest at the event. Marxhausen will be constructing enormous cardboard animals in three-dimension in order to stimulate the creativity of the children by using animals as inspiration.
