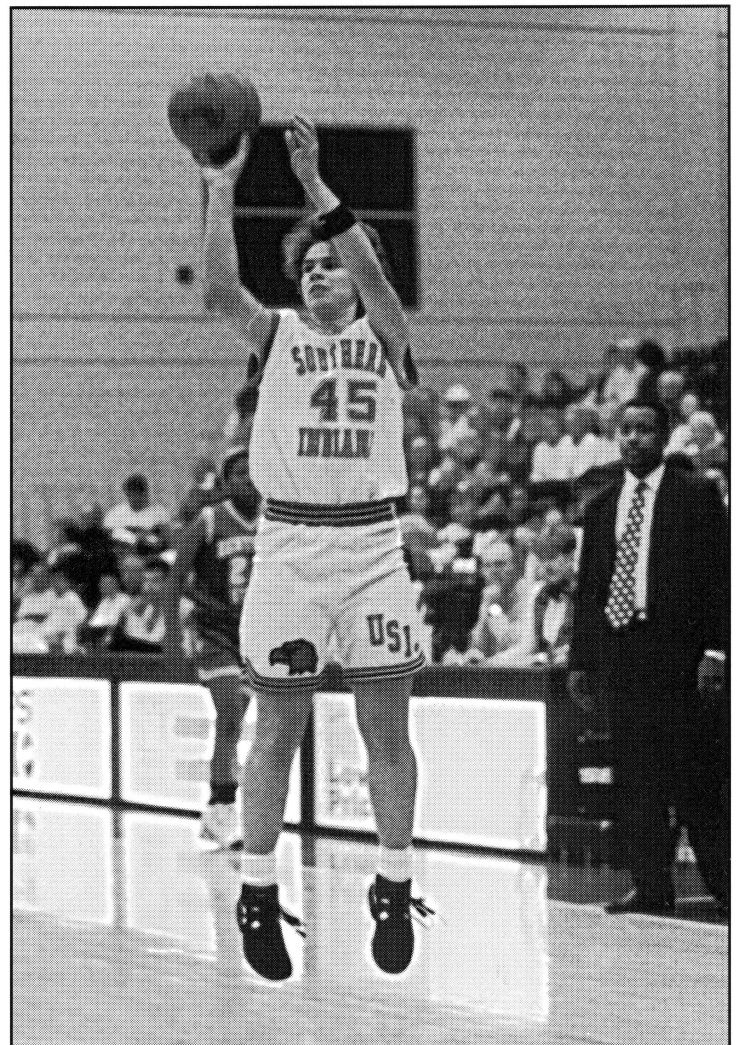

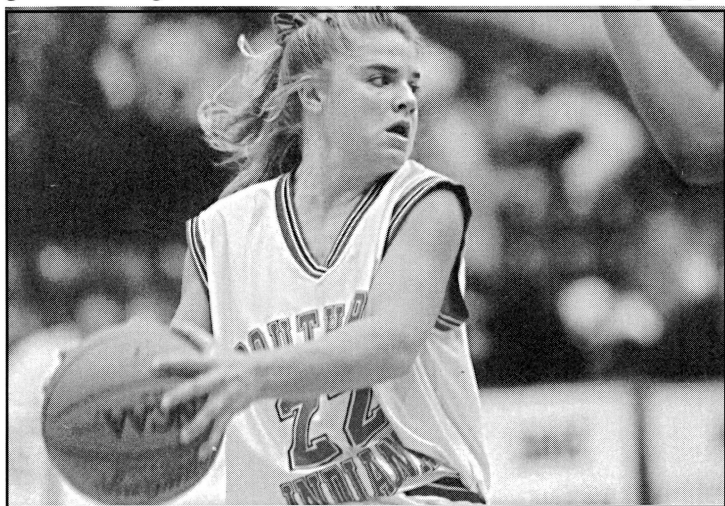
# WOMEN'S BASKETBALL OUTLOOK

## TAKING THE NEXT STEP

In 1995-96 the Lady Screaming Eagles will be taking the next big step in their quest to reach the national spotlight.

In 1994-95, the Lady Eagles had their best season in school history, setting a school record for wins (22), winning their first Great Lakes Valley Conference championship, and making their first trip to the NCAA Division II Tournament. The squad also broke 13 individual records.

What propelled USI to these heights was a school record 15-game winning streak to start the season. In total, the Lady Eagles

won 16-straight games from the end of 1993-94 season into the 1994-95 season.

The accomplishments of last season are the reward for the work Head Coach **Chancellor Dugan** has applied since her arrival in 1991-92. Dugan inherited a team which was 3-25 in 1990-91 and won only eight games in 91-92.

Since that first season, Dugan's Lady Eagles have soared higher and higher. The squad nearly doubled their wins in 1992-93, going 15-15 and just missed the NCAA Tournament in 1993-94 with a 17-10 record, before the success of 1994-95.

The challenge facing the Lady Eagles in 1995-96 is to remain on top of the GLVC and improve upon the performance in the NCAA tournament.

"We are looking forward to this year more than any other," said Dugan. "We have a great challenge ahead of us to repeat as conference champions."

Returning to lead the way is the 1995 *College Sports'* magazine NCAA II Player of the Year, **LeAnn Freeland** (Sims, Ill.), a junior forward. The 6-0 GLVC Player of the Year led the league in scoring (24.4 ppg, 658 points), blocked shots (69), and field goal percentage (.631, 265/420), setting single season and game records in the first two categories. Nationally, Freeland was fifth in scor-

ing and ninth in blocked shots.

The 1995-96 *College Sports* preseason Player of the Year for Division II, Freeland also finished second in the GLVC in rebounding, averaging 9.2 per game. She is USI's second women's basketball player to be named Kodak/WBCA All-American.

Showing versatility by playing both as a forward and a guard in 1994-95, 5-11 senior **Deb Pope** (Maroa, Ill.), who had a career high 12.6 ppg and 3.9 rpg last year, will return for her final season as a utility player.

Pope, who will split time between positions again this year, led the nation in three point field goal percentage, hitting 50.7 percent (74/146) from beyond the arc for the season, a USI single season record. She also set a GLVC record for three-point field goal percentage, hitting 52.2 percent (60/115) in 18 conference games.

Returning to join Freeland in the frontcourt is the GLVC Newcomer of the Year, **Eileen Weber** (Washington, Ind.), a 6-0 sophomore. Weber, who was named to the second team All-GLVC, averaged 14.2 ppg and 7.5 rpg as a freshman in 1994-95 despite missing a game due to a sprained ankle.

Alongside Weber and Freeland in the front-court is 5-8 senior forward **Curita Bonner** (DeKalb, Ill.). Bonner, who made the switch from junior college guard to a USI forward last year, became a defensive and rebounding force on the inside, averaging 8.2 ppg and 7.1 rpg.

"The experience of making the tournament has given the returning players confidence and their leadership will be invaluable. Our goal is to return to the tournament and advance to the Elite Eight," said Dugan.

The one loss the Lady Eagles will have to overcome is that of four-year letterwinner Missy Hart, last season's team captain, and the fourth leading scorer (11.4 ppg).

Taking on added responsibility with the departure of Hart is 5-6 senior guard **Daria Weitekamp** (Sullivan, Ind.). Weitekamp led the team in assists with 5.3 per game (fourth in the GLVC) and also averaged 8.8 ppg.

Joining Weitekamp in the backcourt is 5-7 senior guard **Stacey Roby** (Owensboro, Ky.) and 5-4 sophomore guard **Randa Gatling** (Evansville, Ind.).

Gatling averaged 1.7 ppg 1.1 rpg, and 10.4 minutes in 10 games as a freshman. Roby joined the team late last season and averaged 0.8 ppg and 0.4 rpg in eight games off the bench.

To give the team some depth both in the front- and backcourt, Dugan has four newcomers to the roster. "With this year's team, we are looking to improve our depth with four newcomers," said Dugan. "They will be relied upon heavily to add to our strength."

In the frontcourt, the Lady Eagles will welcome two freshmen centers, 6-0 **Nicole Coomes** (Richland, Ind.) and 6-0 **Angi Lintker** (Venedy, Ill.). To bring the ball up the court, the team is joined by two freshmen guards in 5-10 **Adrienne Seitz** (Otwell, Ind.) and 5-6 **Christen Miller** (Mitchell, Ind.).

# WOMEN'S COACHING STAFF

## USI HEAD COACH CHANCELLOR DUGAN

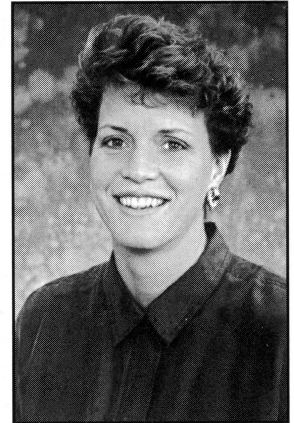
In a step-by-step process over four seasons, University of Southern Indiana Head Coach Chancellor Dugan has directed the Lady Screaming Eagles into the national spotlight.

Dugan ranks number one at USI in winning percentage (.554, 62-50) and second in total wins (62).

In 1994-95, Dugan, who is also an assistant athletic director, led the Lady Eagles to a series of firsts. Dugan's squad had the best record in school history (22-5); made their first appearance in the NCAA Division II Tournament; claimed their first GLVC title; ranked in the NCAA top-20; and had a 16-game winning streak, 15 of the games coming from the 1994-95 season. During the regular season, the team was nationally ranked as high as third.

With the winning streak, Dugan has succeeded in a 180 degree turn around since she took over the helm in 1991-92.

Under Dugan's direction in 1993-94, the Lady Eagles set a school record for wins in a season (17) and a school record for wins in the GLVC (12). In 1993-94 Dugan led the team to a third place finish in the GLVC, the highest ever by a USI women's team. In her second season Dugan led the women's program into the upper division of the GLVC. In 1992-93 she coached the Eagles to a school-record nine wins in the GLVC and fell one game short of tying the school record for wins in a season, with 15 victories.



The first season, Dugan led the women's basketball team to an 8-20 record, which was more wins than the previous two years combined.

The hard-working, enthusiastic Dugan, a native of Louisville, Ky., graduated from Eastern Kentucky University in 1982 with a bachelor's degree in physical education and received a master's degree in physical education in 1989 from Morehead. While an undergraduate at ECU, Dugan was a three-year starter and finished her junior and senior years as the team's leading rebounder and second-leading scorer.

After graduating from ECU, she took the head coaching job at George West High School in George West, Tex., where she guided the team to a 56-30 record in three years.

**NANCY WINSTEL, Northern Kentucky University Women's Head Basketball Coach on Dugan:** "Chancellor has done an excellent job over the last couple of seasons. She has brought USI into the upper division of GLVC and will contend for the championship in a short time. A lot of the improvement can be credited to her coaching."

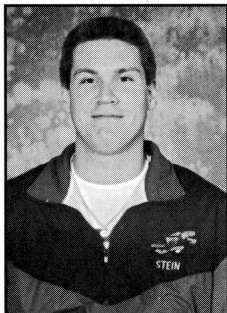

In addition to his duties on the court, Stein teaches activity classes in the Physical Education Department and manages the recently renovated PAC weight room.

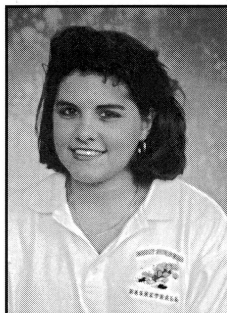

## ASSISTANT COACH SHANNON LITTON



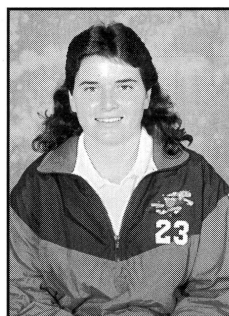

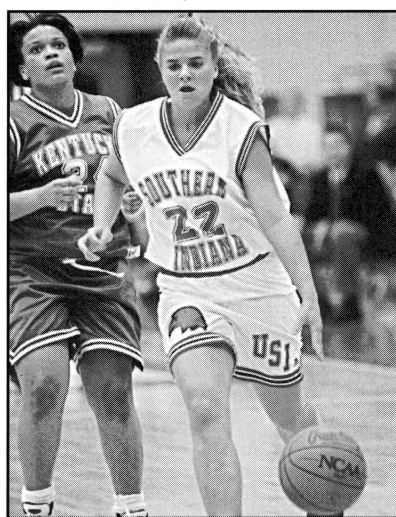
5'11" ...FORWARD...SENIOR...MAROA, ILL. MAJOR: PHYSICAL EDUCATION

**1994-95:** Led the **nation** in three-point field goal percentage (.507, 74/146)...set a USI and tied a GLVC record for three-point field goals in a game (8) versus Kentucky State University...named honorable mention All-GLVC...also named to the Ferris State Bulldog Classic and USI Holiday All-Tournament teams...averaged 12.6 ppg and 3.9 rpg in 27 games...had a career-high 25 points on the road versus Kentucky State and 12 rebounds at home against Indiana/Purdue University Indianapolis. **1993-94:** Led the team and the GLVC in three-point field goal percentage (47.8 percent, 32/67) as a sophomore...played in 24 games, started 11, averaging 8.3 ppg and 3.0 rpg...missed three games and was relegated to coming off the bench in the final six games due to mononucleosis...scored a season-high 20 points against Ashland on the road, and grabbed a career-high nine rebounds at Missouri-St. Louis. **1992-93:** Played in 19 games as a freshman and averaged 1.5 ppg and 1.5 rpg...had a season-high 12 points at home versus Kentucky State University. **HIGH SCHOOL:** Came to USI from Maroa-Forsyth High School in Maroa, Ill...was a four-year starter in volleyball and basketball and a three-year starter in softball (did not play as a senior) at M-FHS...was named to the basketball All-Conference team three times and to the volleyball All-Conference team twice...named the team's Most Valuable Player in basketball and volleyball and the school's Outstanding Senior Female Athlete in 1992...averaged 22.0 ppg, 10.0 rpg, 4.0 apg, and 6.0 steals per game as a senior at M-FHS...holds the M-FHS school record for points in a game with 35 (twice) and scored 1,465 points in four seasons. **PERSONAL:** Born October 6, 1974.

Wayne...also set a USI and GLVC record for blocks in a season (69 overall and 49 in conference games) and a game (10 versus the University of Indianapolis)...set a USI single-season record for points (658)...had a season-high 15 rebounds at home versus IPFW. **1993-94:** Named Most Improved Player (season) after playing in all 27 games, starting 14, as a freshman...was second on the team and tenth in the GLVC in rebounding, averaging 7.5 rpg...third on the team in scoring with 11.6 ppg...averaged 17.8 ppg and 10.3 rpg in the final ten games of 1993-94...had a season-high 27 points versus Ashland and 19 rebounds against SIU-Edwardsville, both at the PAC. **HIGH SCHOOL:** Earned 13 letters in basketball, softball, volleyball, and track at Wayne City High School (Ill.)...was named to the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association first team All-State, *The Evansville Courier* Player of the Year, the Southern Illinois Coaches Association All-South team, and had her jersey retired as a senior...is the all-time leading scorer, boys and girls, in WCHS history with 2,123 points (25 ppg), and averaged 10.3 rpg in 85 games...was named the Lady Indians Most Valuable Player all four years at WCHS and All-Mid South Conference as a freshman and sophomore (the conference was disbanded for basketball after her sophomore season)...also named MVP in softball (sophomore), in volleyball (co-MVP as a senior), and in track (freshman, sophomore, and junior)...had a career batting average in softball of .517. **PERSONAL:** Born June 23, 1975...hobbies include softball, sand volleyball, and reading...ranked fourth in a class of 50 at WCHS.

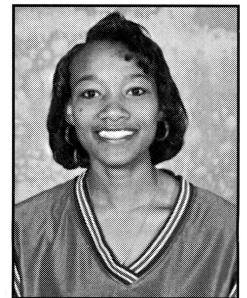
