



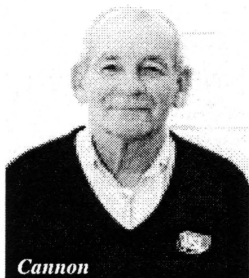

For over 10 years, Mr. Cannon has given direction and leadership to the USI Varsity Club and to USI Athletics. His dedication to USI and his commitment to help the athletic programs succeed is outstanding.

Mr. Cannon maintained and worked the concession stand for almost every Lady Eagles home softball game during the '98 season, volunteered his time at 12 cross-country races, and managed a concession stand for high school cross-country meets held at USI. When unable to volunteer for an event, Mr. Cannon recruited other volunteers to fill the position.

Mr. Cannon is a past chair of the Varsity Club, a past chair of the Fall Festival booth, and chair of the Varsity Club Chili Supper for the past five years. His leadership also has been instrumental in the success of the Golf Scramble and the Steak Fry 'n Auction.

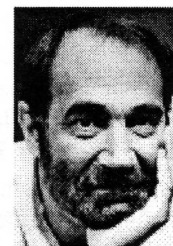

Since the Volunteer USI program began in July of 1996, Mr. Cannon has donated over 675 service hours to USI.

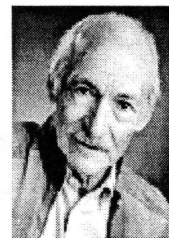
The New Harmony Theatre opens comedy

Tri-State World Trade Council brings foreign trade representatives to campus

The Tri-State World Trade Council will host a briefing and informal discussion on "International Trade Opportunities for Southern Indiana", at 4 p.m. on Thursday, August 6, in Carter Hall.

The Council, a non-profit organization formed in 1982, promotes a shared interest in the development of international trade in the Tri-State area.

Event coordinator **Mr. Tim Mahoney** said that this is another effort by the Tri-State World Trade Council to provide information to local organizations looking for exporting opportunities.

This event will feature panelists employed by the Indiana Department of Commerce who are stationed in trade offices in Brazil, Canada, Europe, Japan, Korea, Mexico, the Pacific, Singapore, and Taiwan. The panelists will discuss topics such as the Asian Crisis, NAFTA, the European Union, and Brazil's emerging market.

In addition, participants will have an opportunity for individual discussions with the panelists. Mahoney cites this as a rare opportunity for local business people to meet and develop direct contact with someone in a foreign marketplace. The telephone number and e-mail address of each panelist will be available for future correspondence.
