1. Important Notice to Employers of Work-Study Students:

Based upon previously established norms, awards were made in the amount of \$250.00 for one semester and \$500.00 for two semesters. Quite a number of these students are now nearing their maximum award earnings. Since the awards are governed by a "need" amount determined by analyzing the Parent's Confidential Statement, we will be required to terminate their employment when they have earned their maximum award total.

We suggest you have each student on this program check with us immediately so we can advise them of their particular status. There are several reasons for this condition. During the first few weeks of September, 1969, a number of students worked several forty-hour weeks instead of the usual fifteen while the move to our new campus was in process. Also, hourly rates are now \$1.45 instead of \$1.30. Reducing the number of hours of a student's work schedule might be advisable in order to slow down their earnings.

Friday, February 20, 1970, has been proclaimed by the Faculty Council and Dean Rice as Library Service Day. The Student Union will be sponsoring Contributions for books for our library, in Evansville and the surrounding areas. 12. Evansville Rotary Club - Graduate Fellowships
The Evansville Rotary Club is soliciting candidates for its two nominees for Graduate Fellowships provided by the Rotary Foundation of Rotary International.

The Graduate Fellowships are offered for the academic year 1971-72 and provide for a year of study in a foreign country, with round-trip transportation, registration, tuition, laboratory, books, meals, lodging and incidental living costs all paid. The Fellowship may be awarded for any field of study.

Application for the Graduate Fellowships must be made through a Rotary Club in the Rotary District of permanent residence or place of study when application is made. Near relatives of Rotarians are not eligible. Men and women who are unmarried and between the ages of 20 and 28 inclusive, as of July 1, 1971, may apply.

Fully completed applications must be received by March 10, 1970. The two nominees of Evansville Rotary will be submitted, along with those of 25 other Clubs, for competition at Rotary District Conference in Louisville on April 18. The District will select two winners.
