COMMUNITY HEALTH CARE FORUM. "Why Does Health Care Cost So Much and Does Cost Limit Accessibility?" will be the topic of a panel discussion on Thursday, April 16, at Welborn Baptist Hospital Auditorium. This is the third program in a four-part health care forum sponsored by Welborn Baptist Hospital and ISUE.

A panel of local health care practitioners, hospital and insurance administrators, and social service agency personnel will address health care-related questions of costs and the impact of cost on accessibility. They will also look at what the individual, government, health care institutions, and insurance companies can do to meet the problem of increasing costs.

His review of M. Stahl, Imperiale Herrschaft und Provinciale Stadt will appear in the October, 1981 issue of The American Historical Review.
