## TIAA-CREF MAKES AVAILABLE NEW SUPPLEMENTAL RETIREMENT ANNUITY.

Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America (TIAA) and College Retirement Equities Fund (CREF) now offer a supplemental retirement annuity arrangement to faculty, administrative and clerical/support personnel of ISUE.

Under this program, and others offered by other companies, staff members may -- through a salary reduction agreement with ISUE -- divert part of their compensation before taxes to the purchase of supplemental annuity benefits. These programs are for use by persons who want to set aside tax-deferred retirement funds over and above amounts being accumulated under the University's basic retirement plans.

## NEW MAXIMUM FOR TAX DEFERRED ANNUITY AMOUNTS TO BE EFFECTIVE FOR CALENDAR YEAR 1976.

As reported in the press, sweeping new Federal requirements for private retirement plans were signed into law by President Ford on Labor Day under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974.

One change will be of particular interest to many TIAA-CREF participants. The act establishes new limitations, in addition to those of Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code, on tax-deferred annuity contributions, whether made as part of an institution's retirement plan or as "extras" under a salary reduction agreement. For most people, the main effect of new limits, which do not become effective under January 1, 1976, will be to restrict tax-deferred annuity contributions in any one year to 25% of current salary or the maximum permitted under Section 403(b), whichever is less. There are alternative limits, yet to be clarified by regulations, which may permit somewhat higher tax-deferred annuity contributions. However, beginning January 1, 1974, the new limits will make the recognition of prior years of service in the 403(b) formula almost useless except under certain limited conditions.

The new limits will not affect tax-deferred annuity contributions during the balance of 1974 and all of 1975. Salary reduction agreements for tax-deferred contributions for 1976 and thereafter may then be made within the new limits.

Thus, the Tax Deferred Annuity Agreement Form for the 1975 calendar year will be your last opportunity to take advantage of the present tax-deferred annuity maximums which apparently are more liberal than the new maximums to be effective January 1, 1976.

The 1975 forms are being prepared for distribution and are to be signed and on file in the Personnel Office before December 3, 1974 to be effective January 1, 1975. If you have any questions, please call Ext. 270.
