1. Institutional Data for Dr. Bennett

Dr. Bennett would like each faculty advisor to keep notes relative to our retention record. We need to know why students leave the institution, as well as what can be done to retain them. It is suggested that advisors, particularly Division Chairmen, cooperate by preparing a summation of conferences with students which would present information about the matter. We will need to have this information available for the examining committee of the North Central. Please direct such reports to Dr. Bennett.

2. Fire Codes and Regulations

Fire codes and regulations pertaining to public buildings require that a monthly fire drill be held. The fire marshall schedules these randomly throughout the month. When the fire alarm is sounded, all occupants of the building must immediately vacate the building by the shortest available safe route.

Non-compliance is a violation of the rules and regulations enforceable by law. The greater problem is that of subjecting students to possible unsafe circumstances in event of actual fires and explosive dangers resulting in suits of negligence against individuals contributing to delayed evacuation.

The actual codes read that the instructors are responsible for taking roll in each class daily and for ascertaining upon evacuation from the building that the total class has left the building. Thus each professor has a legal responsibility to check class attendance and in cases of emergency or emergency training to carry out professional responsibilities for the safety of students under jurisdiction at assigned times.
