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COMMENCEMENT 1980. The 1980 Commencement will be held Saturday, May 10 at 9:00 a.m. in the new Health, Physical Education, and Recreation building.

Approximately 400 students will be completing degree requirements for associate and baccalaureate degrees. The speaker this year will be Dr. W. Ann Reynolds, provost of Ohio State University. Honorary degrees will be awarded to Monsignor Thomas James

Clarke, retired chancellor of the Catholic Diocese of Evansville; Roderic Malcolm Koch, executive vice president of George Koch sons; and Charles Wayne Worthington, president and chairman of the board of National City Bank.

Faculty members and administrative personnel who are participating in Commencement will assemble in the two classrooms on the second floor of the north end of the HPER building no later than 8:30 a.m. Please bring your academic regalia with you. The academic procession will begin forming at the Gymnastic Court on the second floor of the HPER building at 8:00 a.m.

Ample seating is available for family and friends who wish to attend the Commencement ceremony. No tickets will be issued and all are welcome.

Plan to arrive early.

ISUE ALUMNI ASSOCIATION PRESENTS FIRST FACULTY RECOGNITION AWARD. Last Saturday night at the Annual Alumni Dinner/Dance, the ISUE Alumni Association chose DR. MELVIN DENNER, science and mathematics division chairman and professor of biology, as recipient of the first Faculty Recognition Award. Also honored that night were PRESIDENT DAVID L. RICE who received the Special Recognition Award and Mrs. Aline Renner Mr. and Mrs. William E. Couch, who received the Distinguished Alumni Award.

DR. DENNER was chosen because of his "significant teaching contribution to ISUE. He was praised for his "inspirational counsel and teaching ability." A scholarship in DR. DENNER's name will be awarded next year.

DR. RICE received the Special Recognition Award for the role he played in the development of ISUE. Under his guidance the University has been awarded a ten year accreditation, enrollment has topped 3,000 students, and many new programs have been initiated.

In recognition of their outstanding contributions to the Alumni Association, Mrs. Renner and the Couches received the Distinguished Alumni Award. Over the years they have supported the University through their assistance to the Century Club, Varsity Club, Mid-America Singers, HPER building Fund, and the Madrigal festivities. Also, this spring Mrs. Renner and Mr. and Mrs. Couch agreed to underwrite a Challenge Grant, enabling the Alumni Association to expand its areas of support.

One result of the Challenge Grant is the Alumni Association was able to award 15 scholarships this year to students who demonstrated academic achievement, service to the University and community, and financial need. ISUE women's volleyball coach DEBBIE SCHUTTE will conduct a volleyball camp for two weeks, July 7 through 17. The camp will run daily from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday. The cost of the camp is \$40.00.
