NCAA MEMBERSHIP RECEIVED. Indiana State University Evansville has been elected to active membership in the National Collegiate Athletic Association effective immediately. Word was received in the Office of the President October 21. ISUE has Division II status. Prior to the announcement, ISUE was an associate member of the NCAA.

GENERAL EDUCATION 100. The Curricular Committee gave initial approval for a new course, General Education 100, at its regular meeting on Wednesday, October 23. General Education 100 is an interdisciplinary course proposed by the ISUE Bicentennial Committee and in 1975-76 "will concern itself with the Age of the American Revolution and comprise the perspectives of a number of ISUE faculty members."

Curricular Committee approval followed approval by committees of all five academic divisions.
