Campaign USI celebrated the achievements of its volunteers on Saturday, May 30, announcing that to date, more than \$13.5 million has been raised, surpassing the initial goal of \$10.5 million. Although USI staff will continue to call on donors, volunteer solicitations for the campaign are complete. Gifts will be accepted through December 1998.

USI President H. Ray Hoops congratulated the 300 volunteers who assisted with solicitations in the Friends Division and the Alumni Division. He commented that, to date, nearly 1,500 donors made gifts to the campaign.

Mr. Jim Giancola, chair of *Campaign USI*, reporting on the success of the campaign said, "*Campaign USI* has been about elevating this University to a new level of service. The gifts which have come in will have a dramatic impact on the University, its students, and its faculty. He outlined some of the developments to expect as a result of the campaign:

Ten new Presidential Scholarships have been endowed, bringing the USI Foundation to a point where half of its Presidential Scholarships are endowed.

Faculty in every academic school will have funding available to keep their knowledge current, meaning that USI students have the best instruction possible from a faculty dedicated to superior teaching and learning.

The University's first endowed chair will make it possible to begin researching and teaching at a level not possible before, attracting to USI one of the country's best scholars in the emerging field of marketing sciences.

The new Liberal Arts Center will have state-of-the-art instructional technology, opening exciting ways for students to learn and professors to teach.

Outmoded chemistry labs will be replaced with new facilities and equipment, enabling USI students to learn research concepts which will allow them to compete with graduates of the nation's finest universities.

The intercollegiate athletic program will grow and expand as new opportunities are afforded by the renovation of the Physical Activities Center, including the new Varsity Club Room.

Giancola announced that \$13,375,011 had been raised in *Campaign USI* with an additional \$6,083,225 in future endowments.

The New Harmony Theatre

The New Harmony Theatre joins with the USI Art Department and the New Harmony Gallery of Contemporary Art to begin a new tradition at Murphy Auditorium during The New Harmony Theatre summer season. Murphy Auditorium will serve as an art gallery for USI art students whose work was selected from the art on display during the USI Student Art Show held in the spring.

Four artists presented their portfolios to **Mr. Scott LaFeber**, artistic director of The New Harmony Theatre. Pieces were chosen based upon their artistic value and theatrical merit. The pieces will be hung in Murphy Auditorium by employees of New Harmony Gallery of Contemporary Art.

Ms. Jennifer Stuart, coordinator of public relations/marketing, theatre management, said, "this will provide USI art students an opportunity to display their best work in a public place while adding interest to Murphy Auditorium lobby."

Artists whose work will be displayed are **Ms. Erin Evans, Mr. Chris Herndon, Ms. Joy Kizlin, and Ms. Tonya Royster** (her "Dance Studio" painting also appears on the cover of The New Harmony Theatre playbill). The selected art work will be recognized opening night of New Harmony Theatre's first play of the season, *Dames at Sea*, 8 p.m. Friday, June 12.

Dames at Sea, a spoof of 1930s musicals, continues through June 28.

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Curtain times are Thursday, 7:30 p.m.; Friday and Saturday, 8 p.m.; Sunday, 2 p.m. Tickets are \$14 for University faculty, staff, and students. Discounted season tickets are \$32. Call 682-3115 for information or to order tickets. Checks, MasterCard, VISA, and Discover are accepted.

All performances are held in Murphy Auditorium, 419 Tavern Street, New Harmony.




Names in the news


Report gifts-in-kind:

Car wash:




