SUMMER HUMAN RELATIONS INSTITUTE UNDERWAY

Seventy-eight persons are enrolled in the ISUE Division of Education sponsored in-service training in human relations made possible by a Health, Education, Welfare funded grant recently awarded to Indiana State University Evansville. The \$115,776 grant allowed for a six-week summer workshop and ten one-day workshops throughout the year. The summer workshop began July 16 at ISUE.

Participants in the workshop are teachers, counselors and administrators in the Evansville-Vanderburgh School Corporation. Each elementary and secondary school has a representative attending the workshop.

The workshop is concentrating on intensive training in Black History and Literature, methods and materials for culturally different youth and training in human relations, conflict prevention, conflict management and problem solving techniques.

Glenn Kinzie, Professor of Education, wrote the grant proposal and is the Program Director. Mrs. Judy Hummel has been named Project Coordinator for the summer institute. (More about Mrs. Hummel in New Faces.)

FUEL SHORTAGE NEWS CONFERENCE ON CAMPUS

Mr. M. G. Pranga, Energy Economist with Standard Oil Company of Indiana and Mr. Louis Kincannon, President of Golden Imperial, Inc., will appear live in a press conference over

the Indiana Higher Education Telecommunications System (IHETS) channel on July 24, 1973 at 8:30 a.m. The press conference will be aired in Room 28 at ISUE. Mr. Pranga and Mr. Kincannon will discuss the gasoline shortage in this area.

At Standard Oil of Indiana, Mr. Pranga is responsible for long-range planning studies concerning the demand and supply of energy on both a domestic and international basis.

Representing the interests of independent dealers at the press conference, Louis Kincannon operates 48 independent gasoline stations in Indiana. He is a member of the District Two Advisory Subcommittee to the Federal Oil Policy Committee. He was appointed to this committee as a part of the federal government's attempt to investigate the oil shortage.

The televised press conference is the second in a series sponsored by the state universities and the two-way communications capabilities of IHETS. The conference will originate in Bloomington, Indiana and will be seen on 13 state university campuses (including all regional campus sites) throughout Indiana.

Reporters will be able to question both men in the studio at Bloomington. Faculty, administration, and staff interested in the fuel shortage now facing the nation are invited to attend. However, only media representatives can question the two men.
