EDUCATION HONORARY ESTABLISHED. Kappa Delta Pi, a national education honor society which has been in existence since 1911, has established the Xi Mu Chapter on the ISUE campus.

At a banquet November 7, 175 persons from ISUE were initiated into the chapter. On hand for the ceremonies were Dr. Clementine Skinner, National President of Kappa Delta Pi, and Dr. Richard McElheny, National Executive Secretary of the society.

Three ISUE faculty members who have been members of Kappa Delta Pi prior to its charter at ISUE were on hand to participate. They are ALDO CARDARELLI, Associate Professor of Education; KENNETH SETTLE, Chairman of the Division of Business; and DAVID RICE, President of ISUE. Several members of the ISUE faculty were among the first initiates.

There are approximately 300 chapters of Kappa Delta Pi in the United States. The organization seeks to honor those who exhibit the scholarly, personal and character traits desirable in persons working in education. DR. CARDARELLI noted that beyond that purpose, the Xi Mu Chapter would provide for continuing education for its members, with seminars and workshops scheduled throughout the year.

SCREAMING EAGLES OPEN 1977 - 1978 SEASON. ISUE will open its 1977-78 basketball season Saturday night, November 26 when the Screaming Eagles take on Oakland City College at 8:00 p.m. in ISUE Arena. Athletic Director and Basketball Coach WAYNE BOULTINGHOUSE commented, "We have a real fine opponent in Oakland City and have created quite a rivalry with this team. Oakland City has a bona fide All-American in 6'8" Curt Gilstrap. If they defeat ISUE, it will make their season for them."

According to BOULTINGHOUSE, the Eagles' strength lies in its overall team spirit and depth. "We have more talent available to us than we've had in the past." Though the ISUE Coach says the team's defense is not up to expectations yet, "I assure you we will be exciting and I encourage all the ISUE fans to come out Saturday night to cheer the Eagles on," he said.

For those Eagles fans unable to attend the game Saturday night, the contest will be broadcast live on WROZ radio. WROZ will also broadcast seven other ISUE basketball games this season. They are: Transylvania on November 28, Missouri Baptist on January 7, Kentucky Wesleyan on February 1, Southern Illinois University - Edwardsville on February 4, Campbellsville on February 9, St. Francis on February 16, and Indiana University-Southeast on February 20.

A weekly update on the progress of the Screaming Eagles will be given each Friday at 7:45 a.m. on WIKY radio when COACH BOULTINGHOUSE is interviewed. The weekly interviews will begin December 2 and run throughout the basketball season.
