CANNONS AND MUSKETS ON THE OHIO TO BE HELD AT ISSUE. The Second Annual Cannons and Muskets on the Ohio will be held at ISSUE on Saturday and Sunday, June 13 and 14, to kick-off the 1981 Freedom Festival.

The public is invited to attend the scheduled events which include cavalry and infantry drills, an artillery competition, a tea, a military ball with a ball gown competition, and church services. The highlight of the activities will be the re-enactment of a Civil War battle.

The Battle of Chickamauga, which was fought September 18 - 20, 1863 and called the "bloodiest battle of the western theater of the Civil War", will be re-enacted on Sunday afternoon at 1:30. Although the battle was technically a Confederate victory, it was a costly one. Confederate losses totalled 20,950 and Union losses 16,179.

NEW LIFE INSURANCE INFORMATION. Effective July 1, 1981 the Travelers Insurance Company will replace the Equitable Life Assurance Society as the University carrier for life insurance. A premium proposal of \$.34 per \$1000 for life insurance and \$.04 per \$1000 for accidental death and dismemberment coverage was approved by the Board of Trustees.

The University will pay the full cost of the first \$18,000 of coverage and the excess cost over \$.30 per \$1000 for life insurance amounts in excess of \$18,000. The staff member will continue to pay \$.30 per \$1000 for life insurance and \$.04 per \$1000 for accidental death and dismemberment coverage amounts over \$18,000. The changes in deductions will be reflected in the June 12, 1981 paychecks for bi-weekly employees and the August 1, 1981 paychecks for monthly employees.

WATERCOLOR U.S.A. 1981 TOUR. Jerry Baum will lend his expertise as an artist and teacher for a tour to Watercolor U.S.A., a national competitive exhibition that has been sponsored by the Springfield, Missouri Art Museum since 1962. The ISUE tour, offered by the Office of Continuing Education, will be on Saturday and Sunday, June 20 and 21.

The tour will leave ISUE by chartered bus at 6:30 a.m. on Saturday, June 20, and will return at approximately 8:00 p.m. on Sunday, June 21. The \$100 registration fee covers transportation and lodging in Springfield (double occupancy).

OPEN ENROLLMENT FOR BLUE CROSS-BLUE SHIELD. The Blue Cross-Blue Shield group insurance program at ISUE provides that during the month of the policy anniversary date open enrollment is available to all eligible employees who have not previously enrolled.

Present members who are married and are carrying the single Blue Cross-Blue Shield plan and now would like to include spouse and/or children in their coverage may do so during June to be effective July 10, 1981.

The cost is \$9.68 per month for single coverage and \$24.48 per month for family coverage. Full-time faculty and staff members who wish to take advantage of this open enrollment opportunity should contact the Personnel Office, Room 101A in the Administration Building to obtain details and to complete the enrollment form.

INCREASE IN BLUE CROSS-BLUE SHIELD INSURANCE RATES. Blue Cross-Blue Shield premium rates will be increased as a result of higher medical care costs and increased utilization of the program by covered University employees and their families. Staff members will continue to pay 25 percent of the cost, and the University will contribute 75 percent of the cost. The old and new employee share of monthly premium cost is as follows:


