President's Associates Dinner held on campus for the first time

USI President H. Ray Hoops and Mrs. Linda Hoops welcomed members of the President's Associates to a gala dinner on Wednesday, September 3, in Josephine K. Carter Hall, a spacious room that was constructed as part of the University Center expansion.

Carter Hall served as an apt location because **Mr. Jennings D. "Nick" Carter**, a member of the President's Associates, contributed the money to make the completion of the hall possible as a memorial to his wife **Josephine**. Multipurpose in nature, the hall can be conveniently sectioned to accommodate workshops, large lectures, dinners, and student events.

The President's Associates are USI's most generous donors. Annual Members give at least \$1,000 a year and Perpetual Members make a single gift of \$25,000 or more.

Mr. Ted Ziemer, Jr., chair of the USI Foundation, said more than \$5.8 million in gifts were given to USI in the last fiscal year, an 87 percent increase over the previous year. He said the President's Associates include 643 members who have given 92 percent of this year's \$5.8 million total. The President's Associates roll shows 167 more

members than a year ago; 125 joined for the first time and 18 are new Perpetual Members. The increased giving was due in large part to *Campaign USI*, the University's first capital campaign, which was started a year ago.

Dr. Hoops recognized the generosity of the donors and said there was no question the campaign had sparked the increase in giving. "The dramatic response to *Campaign USI* is being felt across the University as we implement new programs to take our level of service higher than ever," Dr. Hoops said. "With less than a year to completion, we are optimistic that we will meet and even exceed our campaign goals.

"We have made significant progress in funding the featured objectives of the campaign," he added. "At the same time, our alumni and friends have sustained the important programs which were in place before the

University Center open house

The ribbon will be cut at 1 p.m. and open House will be held from 1 to 3 p.m. Sunday, September 14, in the official celebration completion of the \$4.7-million University Center expansion. The UC was opened in 1974 and the expansion nearly doubled the original 52,000-square-foot facility. Features include an additional entrance on the south side with ready access to Carter Hall on the second level, a multipurpose area which will seat 530 people for dining and 750 for meetings. The addition increased space for Student Life offices, conference facilities, student publications and other student activities offices, and for student recreation and lounge areas. A computer lab, a small art gallery, and formal meeting and dining areas were incorporated into the expansion.
