A musical myriad will ring through Forum I at the University of Southern Indiana when the Mid-America Singers present their spring program at 7:30 p.m. Friday, April 7.

It will be music to satisfy all tastes, from age 2 to 102, with a program ranging from bop to rock, swing to country, as well as sing-along ballads and gospel music.

In addition to entertaining their Tri-State friends, the Singers will be preparing for a trip to Washington, D. C., April 28-29, when they will join 14,000 other young people to compete in "America Sings '89." The event will culminate with a filmed extravaganza at the Lincoln Memorial, courtesy of PBS. Proceeds from "America Sings '89" will be donated to charitable projects aiding homeless children.

There will be a \$3 admission fee for the Singers' spring program, with \$2 to be used to help defray costs of the Washington trip and \$1 to be donated to the homeless children fund. The Singers also will present a concert in the nation's Capitol.
