# University of Southern Indiana

## 1999 Women's Soccer Outlook

In three seasons, the University of Southern Indiana women's soccer program has leapt from its inaugural season into the national spotlight.

The Eagles, who are ranked **tenth** nationally in the preseason poll, hope to become the center of attention, taking a run at the NCAA Division II national championship.

In 1998, the Screaming Eagles made an appearance in the NCAA Division II Tournament, winning the Central Regional and hosting a NCAA quarterfinal match before losing in a triple overtime defeat. The squad had an .840 winning percentage, 18-3-1 overall record, 9-1-0 Great Lakes Valley Conference record, and placed second in the GLVC Tournament.

USI, who is picked to win the GLVC in 1999, is 38-18-2 overall with a .672 winning percentage.

To reach their goal, the Eagles take a slightly different course as new **Head Coach Bill Wilkins** assumes the helm this fall. Wilkins intends to employ an aggressive and offensive style of soccer which should fit the Eagles well. USI outscored their opponents 58-13 in 1998.

The Valley Cottage, New York, started his coaching career as an assistant coach at the State University of New York at Cortland. From there, Wilkins had a three-year stint as the head women's soccer coach at Columbia University in New York from 1985-87 and a single season at the United States Military Academy in 1984.

Wilkins posted successful seasons at Auburn University and the University of Virginia before moving to USI. He led a fledgling Auburn team to a 47-44-8 overall record in five seasons. While an assistant at Virginia, he helped the Cavaliers advance to five NCAA Division I Tournament appearances and a berth in the Final Four.

On the field, Wilkins's Eagles will be led by first team All-American junior back **Amy Henkhaus** (Edwardsville, Illinois) and second team All-American midfielder **Megan Russell** (Evansville, Indiana). Both were named first team All-Central Region and All-GLVC.

Henkhaus's outstanding marking ability helped the Eagles' defense to a 0.56 goals against average, fifth nationally, and first in the GLVC.

Russell led the team in scoring with 38 points on 12 goals and 14 assists. Her assist total ranked 17th nationally. In addition, the senior midfielder also ranked fourth in scoring, second in assists, and tied for fifth in goals in the GLVC.

Henkhaus and Russell did not have a monopoly on the post-season awards, as they were joined on the first team All-Region and All-GLVC by junior forward **Stephanie Minor** (Evansville, Indiana).

Minor, who was named to the All-Region team for the second year in a row, was second on the team in scoring with 29 points, on 12 goals, tying Russell for the team lead, and five assists. She tied for fifth

in scoring and goals in the GLVC, despite missing the first two games of the year.

In the backfield with Henkhaus, the Eagles have senior **Angie Gries** (Evansville, Indiana), the GLVC's top goalkeeper. Gries, who has led the GLVC the last two seasons, was seventh nationally with a 0.59 GAA in 22 games.

In three seasons, Gries has a 0.79 GAA in 47 matches and 19.5 shutouts.

Junior goalkeeper **Heather Heseman** (Evansville, Indiana) will back up Gries between the posts. She played in eight contests as a sophomore and had a 0.33 GAA with three shutouts.

In front of Gries in the USI backfield is a solid set of veterans. Along with Henkhaus, the Eagles return junior backs **Andrea Barchet** (Evansville, Indiana), **Krista Weinzapfel** (Mt. Vernon, Indiana), and **Amy Zawada** (Newburgh, Indiana).

Barchet, who moved into the line-up after an injury to Anne Bristol in 1998, filled her shoes marvelously at sweeper, starting 21 of 22 matches in the backfield.

Weinzapfel also jumped into a starting role as a sophomore at outside back. She started and played in 21 matches, missing one to injury, scoring four points on one goal and two assists.

In the midfield, Russell and her teammates will have to fill the void left by graduating Jessica Pigman, who was a first team All-Region and second team All-GLVC performer. Pigman also was second on the team in assists.

Five players return in 1999 to join Russell in the middle. Leading the way is sophomore

**Megan Ehlers** (Loveland, Ohio), who had nine points (four goals) in 21 starts in 1999.

They are joined by senior **Kristy Weber** (Lawrenceburg, Indiana), who started all 22 matches and had seven points on two goals and three assists; senior **Kristi Butler** (Newburgh, Indiana), who came off the bench in 20 matches to score seven points on two goals and three assists; sophomore **Kayla Scheller** (Evansville, Indiana), who had seven points on three goals and one assist in 22 matches; and sophomore **Jenny Wessel** (St. Louis, Missouri), who played in 13 contests, scoring a goal.

Up front, the Eagles have a potent offense behind Minor with senior forward **Laura Preske** (Evansville, Indiana) and junior **Kelly Lewis** (Newburgh, Indiana).

Preske, who also saw action in the midfield and in the backfield, was fourth on the team in scoring with 12 points on five goals and two assists. Lewis, one of the fastest Eagles on the team, had ten points on five goals.

In addition, USI returns sophomore **Kristen Light** (Florissant, Missouri), who saw a tremendous amount of playing time as a freshman in 22 matches, scoring five points on two goals and one assist.

Newcomers who will challenge for starting positions include: **Megan Fitzler** (Maryland Heights, Missouri), a freshman midfielder who played for Pattonville High School last spring; **Jill Hejlek** (St. Louis, Missouri), a freshman back who played for Ursuline Academy last year; and **Pleasant Lant** (Chandler, Indiana), who attended USI last year after graduating from Castle High School in 1998.

# Bill Wilkins

## Women's Soccer Head Coach

Bill Wilkins assumes the helm of the University of Southern Indiana women's soccer program in 1999.

A coach with national exposure at the Division I level, Wilkins comes to USI from Auburn University where he had been the head coach since the 1994 season. Wilkins, who took over Auburn's program in its second season of existence, led the Tigers to their first wins in the NCAA Division I and the Southeastern Conference and their first-ever regional ranking. In his five seasons, he has compiled an overall record of 47-44-8.

Prior to taking the head position at Auburn, Wilkins helped the University of Virginia women's soccer program to five consecutive NCAA I Tournament appearances as an assistant coach. During the 1991 NCAA Tournament, he assumed interim head coaching duties prior to the tournament and led the Cavaliers to a berth in the Final Four and a final national ranking of number three.

The Valley Cottage, New York, native went to Virginia following a three-year stint as the head women's soccer coach at Columbia University in New York from 1985-87 and a single season at the United States Military Academy in 1984.

Wilkins started his coaching career at the grassroots level after graduating from St. Lawrence University in Canton, New York in 1977. His first job was as girls' varsity head coach at Albertus Magnus High School in Bardonia, New York, before entering the collegiate ranks as an assistant coach at the State University of New York at Cortland.

During his only season at SUNY Cortland, Wilkins helped lead the women's program to the NCAA Tournament quarterfinals and was ranked third nationally.

In addition to his coaching duties, Wilkins was the NSCAA Division I national ranking committee chairman for the past two seasons. He also was the Field of Play coordinator for the 1996 Olympic Games in Birmingham, Alabama.

Wilkins has been a NSCAA member since 1982 and has a NSCAA Advanced National Diploma and a USSF National "B" License.

Wilkins was married on August 27, 1997 during the Auburn University soccer trip to Hawaii to the former Leigh-Anne Masters. The couple have one son, Garrett.

Jessica Pigman will make the transition from player to assistant coach in 1999. She will assist with daily practices, game operations, and administrative office duties.

In three seasons, Pigman finished her career at USI as the third all-time leader in assists (16), fourth all-time in total points (44), and fifth all-time in goals (12). A co-captain each of her three seasons, Pigman helped lead the Screaming Eagles to a quarterfinal finish in the NCAA Division II Tournament and to a team record of 38-18-2.

As a senior, Pigman was named first team All-Central Region and second team All-Great Lakes Valley Conference. She also

was named the 1999 GLVC Scholar Athlete of the Year (women's soccer) and to the Academic All-GLVC team in each of her three seasons.

A native of Evansville, Indiana, Pigman graduated in 1999 from USI with a bachelor's degree in physical education. She also is employed as a personal trainer at Resultz Personal Fitness and director of the Kinder Kicks program for boys and girls, ages 4-6, at Off the Wall Sports, an indoor soccer facility in Evansville.
