**DESPITE THE HEAT AND HUMIDITY, ISUE-7UP RACE IS A SUCCESS.** Over three hundred runners turned out for the ISUE-7Up 2-mile and 7-mile races, last Saturday.

It was a humid 88° at 6:00 p.m. when 180 2-mile runners set out on the ISUE course. Bill Gautier of Owensboro came in first with a time of 10:04.2. ISUE-signee James McGehee took second in 10:10.2 and Danny Bateman of Evansville was third at 10:20.7. Wendy Slaton, a former Mater Dei student, won first place in the women's division, finishing in 12:01.1.

Larry Cuzzort ran the 7-mile race in 35:47.4 for first place in front of 134 ambitious runners. The second place time of 37:36.5 was achieved by Bob Gutjahr of Peoria Illinois. Donna Mayer was the women's division winner, finishing in 50:02.1.
