GOVERNOR BOWEN IN PRESS CONFERENCE AT ISUE

ISUE will host, in cooperation with other state universities, the televised press conference in Room 28 on May 3, from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. Members of the local media will be on campus for the event. ISUE faculty, administration and staff are also invited to observe the conference. Only members of the media can pose questions.

IHETS gives the local media an opportunity to see, hear and question Governor Bowen located in the television studios of the Indiana University School of Medicine via the facilities of IHETS.

Future conferences will feature leading persons in government, education, and public affairs.
