ISUE BRINGS NATIONALLY KNOWN SPEAKERS TO CAMPUS NEXT WEEK. A prominent business executive and an Evansville native regarded as a national expert in the legal aspects of medical and health care issues will give lectures on campus during the week of March 16.

David H. College, Vice President of the United States Operation for DeZurik, a subsidiary of General Signal Corporation, will share his 20 years experience in diversified manufacturing, engineering, and management with students majoring in business at ISUE. As the Spring Executive-in-Residence, College will spend the day working with students at ISUE on Monday, March 16. The public is invited to his noon lecture in the University Center.

College will travel from Sartell, Minnesota, where the DeZurik operation is headquartered. DeZurik is a worldwide manufacturer of industrial valves and process controls equipment serving the pulp and paper, water and waste treatment and chemical industries. The U.S. operation includes six plants located in Georgia, Tennessee, Minnesota, and Washington. Other international operations are located in Canada, England, Mexico, Australia, and New Zealand.

Prior to joining DeZurik, College was Director of Manufacturing with multi-plant responsibilities for the WKM Valve Division on A.C.F. Industries. He holds the B.S. degree from Shippensburg State College and the M.B.A. from Rollins College. He is active in numerous professional organizations including the Industrial Management Society, Steel Founder's Society of America, Society of Manufacturing Engineers, National Foundry Association, and the American Production of Inventory Control Society. His interest in young people is demonstrated by his work in the Boy Scouts of America and in Junior Achievement.

Dr. Margery Shaw is the director of the Medical Genetics Center at the University of Texas at Houston where she also holds appointments as professor of jurisprudence and as biologist at the M.D. Anderson Hospital and Tumor Institute. A nationally-respected consultant on legal and social issues of medical genetics and a frequent lecturer at symposia and workshops, Dr. Shaw will present a public lecture in A126, on Thursday, March 19 at 8:00 p.m. on the "Legal Aspects of Medical Genetics". She will also speak at a seminar to which the public is invited on Friday, March 20 at 11:00 a.m. The morning seminar will focus on the chromosomal damage resulting from exposure to toxic chemicals in the workplace and environment. It will be held in UC350.

SPEAKERS (continued). Dr. Shaw, who is a 1940 graduate of Central High School and a member of the Central Hall of Fame, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur G. Schlamp of Evansville. After her graduation from Central, she attended Hanover College and the University of Alabama where she received the B.A. degree, magna cum laude, in 1945. She also holds the M.A. degree from Columbia University, the M.D. from the University of Michigan, and the J.D. degree from the University of Houston. She has undertaken an additional postgraduate studies at Cornell University and Yale Law School. She is president-elect of the American Society for Human Genetics, past president of the Genetics Society of America and a member of the Advisory Committee to the Director of the National Institutes of Health.
