SABBATICAL LEAVES. Seven ISUE professors will take sabbatical leaves during the 1983-84 academic year. In the Fall, John Gottcent, professor of English, will attend Vanderbilt University, Nashville, Tennessee, on a post doctoral study to further develop expertise in the field of literary analysis of the Bible.

During the Spring semester, two professors plan to complete research projects in Evansville. Darell Bigham, professor of history, will conclude seven years of research and writing of the Black family history. Harlan Van Over, professor of business, intends to determine the influence of computers on executives in large industrial corporations.

The remaining professors will be on leave the entire 1983-84 term. Professor of economics Eliseo DaRosa will complete a project on the economic, legal, political, and social changes taking place in the Rio de la Plata region with the construction of three large hydroelectric plants. At the Ecole Polytechnique in Palaiseau, France, Andrew Jorgensen, associate professor of chemistry, plans to investigate various questions in analytical chemistry using the technique of liquid chromatography in collaboration with professor Georges Guiochon, director of the Laboratoire de Chimie Analytique Physique. Sister Victoria Pohl, associate professor of mathematics, plans to attend Ohio State University, Columbus, Ohio, to research and write a booklet on the use of string-art in teaching geometry to junior high students. She will also instruct a course while at Ohio State. Vanderbilt University is the destination of Marlene Shaw, associate professor of life science, to attend graduate and medical school studies in the Department of Microbiology.

ISUE TOUR. Southern traveler Dr. James Blevins, chairman of the division of humanities, will lead an ISUE tour to four Southern cities.

The bus tour leaves on Monday, June 20, and stops to tour the Biltmore House and Gardens in Asheville, North Carolina. Next, two days will be spent in Charleston taking both the walking and driving tours of that city. Then on to Savannah for tours of that city and its historic landmarks. On the 25th, a day of shopping and sightseeing will be spent in Atlanta and then back to Evansville on Sunday, June 26.

The registration fee of \$405.00 includes transportation, breakfast and lunch on the bus, six nights lodging (double occupancy), tour fees, and information packet. Contact the Office of Continuing Education, 464-1863, for registration and additional information.
