



DONATION OF RADIO STATION TO ISUE APPROVED. On June 5, the ISU Board of Trustees approved the donation of radio station WIKY-AM to ISUE. The station will be based on campus, but will broadcast to the entire community.

The station was donated by South Central Broadcasting, owner of both WIKY-AM and -FM. The company is purchasing WROZ-AM--a move which would have left it in possession of two AM radio stations in the same marketing area, which federal law prohibits.

The donation includes the transmitter, studio equipment, and operating license granted by the Federal Communications Commission. The radio station will begin operating in early 1982 and will be staffed by the University's communications students and faculty. Additional information may be obtained from Dr. Kenneth Creech, assistant professor of communications.

TUITION TO INCREASE. In a separate board action on June 5, the Board of Trustees approved a tuition increase for ISUE. In-state students will be paying \$32.00 per semester hour, an increase of \$3.50. Out-of-state students will pay \$72.50 per semester hour, an increase of \$10.50. The tuition increases will become effective this fall.

OPEN ENROLLMENT FOR BLUE CROSS-BLUE SHIELD. The Blue Cross-Blue Shield group insurance program at ISUE provides that during the month of the policy anniversary date, open enrollment is available to all eligible employees who have not previously enrolled.

Present members who are married and are carrying the single Blue Cross-Blue Shield plan and now would like to include spouse and/or children in their coverage may do so during June to be effective July 10, 1981.

The cost is \$9.68 per month for single coverage and \$24.48 per month for family coverage. Full-time faculty and staff members who wish to take advantage of this open enrollment opportunity should go to the Personnel Office, Room 101A, in the Administration Building.

NEW LIFE INSURANCE INFORMATION. Effective July 1, 1981, the Travelers Insurance Company will replace the Equitable Life Assurance Society as the University carrier for life insurance. A premium proposal of \$.34 per \$1000 for life insurance and \$.04 per \$1000 for accidental death and dismemberment coverage was approved by the Board of Trustees.

The University will pay the full cost of the first \$18,000 of coverage and the excess cost over \$.30 per \$1000 for life insurance amounts in excess of \$18,000. The staff member will continue to pay \$.30 per \$1000 for life insurance and \$.04 per \$1000 for accidental death and dismemberment coverage amounts over \$18,000. The changes in deductions will be reflected in the July 1, 1981 paychecks for monthly employees.

LOCAL HEAD START PROGRAM NEEDS DONATIONS. Head Start is a federally-funded program which provides pre-school experiences for children of low-income families. The local Head Start program is seeking donated equipment, toys, books, and supplies for the five centers in need of equipment. These contributions will help the Head Start program meet its 20% local funding requirement. All contributions are tax deductible. 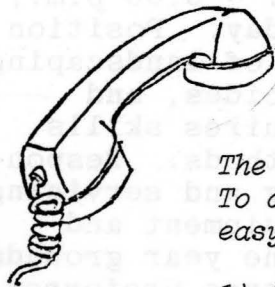

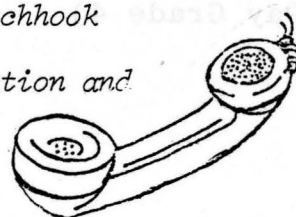


TELEPHONE TIP FOR THE WEEK

The Dimension System at ISUE allows three-way conferences. To add a third party to a conversation, just follow these easy steps:

- 1) Ask the first party to hold
- 2) Depress the switchhook
- 3) After receiving a dial tone, dial desired number
- 4) When the second party answers, depress the switchhook

This allows the first party to rejoin the conversation and a three-way call is established.
