A member of the Mid-America Singers, an ISUE science honorary, Sigma Epsilon Chi, Cynthia Alexander, senior pre-medical major, is active in organizing a new national chapter of Delta Sigma sorority on the Evansville Campus. Past president of Au Naturelles, Cynthia is also active in community scout work and is a church organist for the McFarland Baptist Church.

Active in community, church and university affairs, Fred M. Frayser, junior elementary education major, has been a member of the Mt. Vernon Chapter of DeMolay, serving as Senior Counselor, Master Counselor and awarded the Meritorius Service Award, the first in the 13 year history of the chapter. Fred is an Honorary Hoosier Scholar, a four-year scholarship given by the State Scholarship Commission of Indiana. A zealous participant in university and community growth, Robert J. Keck, senior bio-physics major, is secretary-treasurer of the senior class, senior senator to the Student Senate, vice-president of Sigma Epsilon Chi, a science honorary, member of the Alpha Omega Psi social fraternity and the University Jaycees. Robert is treasurer for the Vanderburgh County Young Republicans Club and on the Board of Christian Education at St. Paul's Lutheran Church. As a bio-physicist, Robert has been working under the supervision of Dr. Billy J. Fairless, ISUE Associate Professor of Chemistry, with metal-complex compounds which might prove useful in the treatment of cancer. Robert is an Honorary Hoosier Scholar and has been awarded the Certificate of Merit for Scholastic Achievement from ISUE. A sports enthusiast, he has participated in ISUE Intramural Sports Program in football, basketball and softball.

Andrew Lindauer, senior English major, is an active ISUE student, being a member of the Student Senate, Alpha Kappa Psi fraternity, Student Education Association and the Pickwick Club, an organization for English majors. Extremely interested and involved in the theatre arts, Andrew has worked with the Mid-America Singers in stage planning and development, and has been a member of the casts in 1971 ISUE production "The Lion in Winter" and the 1972 production "Mary Stuart." Andrew's interest in the theatre has made him well-known in community circles. He is make-up chairman for the Evansville Civic Theatre, and Board member of the Court House Community Theatre.

President of Alpha Kappa Chapter of Sigma Zeta, a National Honorary Science Organization, Imogene Schmitt, senior life science

major, is also president of FISH, an ecumenical student organization, treasurer of Sigma Epsilon Chi, ISUE science club which sponsors seminars once a month for local science-oriented businesses, and vice-president of the senior class. Highly interested in the preservation of the historical, Dale worked with the 1971 Robert Owen Bicentennial Conference and the Indiana University Committee on Historic Preservation with the Evansville Tour in 1972.

Senior management major, Larry Wildt, was president of Alpha Kappa Psi fraternity for three consecutive semesters, on the 1971 Alpha Kappa Psi Scholarship Committee, and received Alpha Kappa Psi Outstanding Student Award and the Alpha Kappa Psi National Fraternity Service Award. Larry was staff photographer for the 1971 ISUE yearbook, TRANSITIONS. He also participates in ISUE intramural softball.

Editor of the school newspaper, THE SHIELD, Gail Wilderman, senior communications major, was active in committee work with the Ohio River Arts Festival (1972-73). In spring 1972 Gail received the Joe Aaron Journalism Scholarship.

Selection is based on criteria set by the university. The criteria includes a minimum of 2.4 grade point average and variety, quality, and quantity of student participation in university activities. Inclusion in Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges allows
