COMMISSIONER KESSLER TO VISIT CAMPUS

Dr. James B. Kessler, Commissioner for Higher Education, will visit Evansville Wednesday, November 24, 1971, to become thoroughly acquainted with the Evansville Campus of Indiana State University, and the university-related community. The purpose of the visit is to conduct an on-site staff study of the Evansville Campus in order to ascertain the nature and extent of community leadership involved with the campus, as well as to review the plans and planning for the campus, and the status of development of the campus in relationship to Senate Resolution 8, enacted by the 1971 General Assembly.

Dr. Kessler will meet with Indiana State University administrators and Evansville community leaders during a breakfast meeting on November 24 at the Executive Inn. Following the meeting, Dr. Kessler will visit the campus.

BUSINESS EDUCATION WORKSHOP SET FOR NOVEMBER 20

Business educators and student teachers in the Tri-State area will meet on Saturday, November 20 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at ISUE for a workshop to be conducted by Dr. Lee R. Beaumont, co-author of CENTURY 21 TYPEWRITING, which is to be released by the South-Western Publishing Company in January.

A featured topic of the workshop, "Typing Copy Makes a Difference", will stress the importance of selecting copy that will insure certain responses from the students. Other topics which Dr. Beaumont will discuss include "What Is Your Typing Quotient" and "Grading in Typewriting Doesn't Tell It Like It Is".

Demonstrations on how to teach typing will highlight the program. A model classroom is to be set up and members of the audience will be asked to participate in Dr. Beaumont's demonstrations.

Following the conclusion of the workshop at 12:30 p.m., an informal buffet is scheduled at the Temporary Union Building on campus. This workshop is directed by Dr. Dona Frost, Associate Professor of Business, and ISUE student Cathy Williams.

MID-STATES ART EXHIBITION

The 24th annual Mid-States Art Exhibition is now on display at the Evansville Museum. John McNaughton, ISUE Assistant Professor in Art, received the Indiana Foundation for the Arts and Sciences, Inc. Merit Award for his entry, "Give Me Liberty or Give Me Gas". This was the only Evansville piece honored.
