## DONNA M. WHITE TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS

The speaker for the Graduate Ceremony is USI graduate Dr. Donna M. White, doctorate of nursing practice class of 2016. Prior to her degree from USI, White earned a bachelor's degree in nursing from Culver-Stockton College in 1989; a master's degree in community health administration and wellness promotion from Independence University in 1996; and a master's degree in nursing education from American Sentinel University in 2012.

White began her career as an obstetrical staff nurse, but moved into nursing management and then worked as a medical review coordinator for the State of Illinois. Her efforts there included assessing the quality of care provided to recipients in various medical facilities across western Illinois.

She also has served as an associate faculty member at John-Wood Community College and as a substitute public school teacher for grades kindergarten through high school.

In her most recent position, Dr. White is an associate professor of nursing at Hannibal-LaGrange University where she also serves as the Registered Nurse to Bachelor of Science in Nursing (RN to BSN) program coordinator. In this role, she is responsible for the direction and coordination of the online RN to BSN Program, including curriculum, program and student outcomes, accreditation and other administrative roles. In her teaching capacity, her courses include capstone, research and evidence-based practice courses.

Dr. White also has served as an associate editor for the *Journal of Christian Nursing*, where she reviewed manuscript submissions, performed copy editing, wrote editorials and collaborated with the editing and publishing team to make decisions on manuscripts for publication for the Journal and the Nurses of Christian Fellowship.

White is a member of several professional organizations, including Nurses Christian Fellowship; Sigma Theta Tau, PIPI Chapter, charter member. She is a Village of Golden trustee, a volunteer with Golden Memorial Gardens, Central High School, and is a harpist for various religious, community and social events.

In 2012, White received the American Sentinel University Deans Award and became a member of the American Sentinel University Nursing Honors Society. She was honored with the University of Southern Indiana Graduate Scholarship Award in 2015.

White resides in Golden, Illinois, on the family farm with her husband. They have three children and one grandson.

## AMY L. BEARD TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS

Amy L. Beard, class of 2009, is the University of Southern Indiana's commencement speaker for the College of Liberal Arts. While attending USI, Beard earned bachelor's degrees in economics and Spanish, with a minor in international studies as a University Honors Scholar and served as student body president. Beard earned her Juris Doctor from the Indiana University McKinney School of Law in 2013.

During her time as a student, Beard worked for the general counsel at Berry Plastics Corporation; the Honorable Martha Blood Wentworth of the Indiana Tax Court; Justice Steven David at the Indiana Supreme Court; and Bamberger, Foreman, Oswald, and Hahn.

Beard has been the general counsel for the Indiana Department of Insurance since 2017. In this role, she is the chief legal officer and provides advice to the Department on all insurance-related matters. Beard started at the Department in 2013 as a health care contractor and later served as an administrative law judge. She then worked as an attorney advising the Department's financial division and served as the legislative liaison. As general counsel, Beard advises the insurance commissioner on matters including domestic insurance companies' acquisitions and mergers, regulatory practices, and numerous other corporate and regulatory issues.

Beard is a member of the State Bar of Indiana, the Indianapolis Bar Association, and the Indiana State Bar Association. She was appointed by the Governor of Indiana as an advisory member of the Indiana Executive Council on Cybersecurity. Beard has worked with the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC) and the Interstate Insurance Product Regulation Commission (IIPRC), and previously served as a member on the IIPRC Regulatory Counsel Committee. She holds the designation of Associate Professional in Insurance Regulation (APIR) from the NAIC. Beard is a member of the USI Foundation Board of Directors and the USI Alumni Association.

In 2017, Beard was named a finalist for "Indy's Best and Brightest" by Junior Achievement of Central Indiana. She is a past recipient of the Phenomenal Women of USI and the Community Award, and the Sherianne Standley University Service Scholarship.

Beard currently resides in Indianapolis.

## WAYNE S. TROCKMAN TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS

---



Wayne S. Trockman '81

The Honorable Wayne S. Trockman, class of 1981 and Vanderburgh Superior Court judge, will be the Commencement speaker for the Romain College of Business. An Evansville native, Trockman graduated from Harrison High School and earned a bachelor's degree in business from USI and his Juris Doctor from Indiana University in 1984. From 1984 to 1999, Trockman practiced law in Evansville before his appointment by Governor Frank O'Bannon to the Superior Court Bench.

In 2001, Trockman organized and implemented the first Drug Treatment Court in Vanderburgh County. This Court, which continues to thrive, serves as an intensive sentencing alternative to non-violent felony drug offenders who have committed crimes within the county. The program, which is partnered with the Indiana Department of Corrections, has reduced recidivism, improved quality of life within the community and diverted thousands of residents convicted of drug crimes from prison to treatment.

Trockman was awarded the Randall T. Shepard Award "in recognition of extraordinary efforts toward making legal services available to persons who otherwise could not afford them" for his service as co-chair of the Volunteer Lawyers Program of Southern Indiana from 2006-12. This program provides more than 3,000 hours of legal services and approximately 300 new cases opened per year for the economically disadvantaged.

For his years of service and contributions to the community, Trockman has received numerous awards and recognitions, including being named a Sagamore of the Wabash by then-Governor and current United States Vice President Mike Pence in 2016, and receiving the James Bethel Gresham Award from the Evansville Bar Association. He also is the recipient of the Jefferson Award from the American Institute of Public Service, the National Association of Drug Court Professionals Community Transition Award (its highest honor) and the Willie Effie Thomas Human Relations Commission Award.

He and his wife Jill reside in Evansville. They have two sons, one of whom is a USI alumnus.

## STANLEY J. TRETTER TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS

The Commencement speaker for the College of Nursing and Health Professions is Dr. Stanley J. Tretter, master's class of 2017. Tretter earned a bachelor's degree *summa cum laude* in biology from Wabash College, a doctorate in medicine from Indiana University with a residency in family practice from Deaconess Hospital in Evansville, and a Masters of Health Administration degree from USI.

Tretter is the vice president of Medical Affairs and chief medical officer for Memorial Hospital and Health Care Center (MHHCC) in Jasper, Indiana, where he also has served as a family physician since 2001. MHHCC annually provides medical care for 6,600 inpatients and 254,000 outpatients, and has received a Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) five-star rating for overall quality of inpatient care since the ratings were released. In 2018, MHHCC was named a recipient of the Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award, presented annually by the National Institute of Standards and Technology and the highest level of national recognition for performance excellence that a U.S. organization can receive.

In addition to his service at MHHCC, Tretter is an assistant designated institutional official for the Indiana University School of Medicine and the health officer for the Spencer County Health Department. He is board certified in family medicine by the American Board of Family Medicine and is a certified medical examiner by the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration.

Tretter's organizational and community service efforts include being the executive director of the Southwestern Indiana Graduate Medical Education Consortium and the Regional Clerkship Site Leader for Family Medicine for the Indiana University School of Medicine. He is a member and past president of the Spencer County Board of Health, an officer for the Edwin C. Tretter Foundation, and has served on numerous councils and committees within MHHCC, including serving as a member of the Board of Directors for Memorial Hospital from 2012-15.

He and his wife Jennifer reside in Ferdinand, Indiana, with their three daughters.

## B. J. WATTS TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS

---



B. J. Watts '01

The speaker for the Pott College of Science, Engineering, and Education Commencement ceremony is B. J. Watts, class of 2001. Watts earned his bachelor's degree in education from USI, where he was a member of the men's basketball team, and a master's degree in education from Indiana Wesleyan University in 2013.

Watts is currently chair of the Indiana State Board of Education, the first person in state history appointed to the position who is not also State Superintendent. Watts was appointed to the State Board by Governor Mitch Daniels in 2012 and was reappointed by then Governor and current United States Vice President Mike Pence in 2015, and Governor Eric Holcomb in 2018. Prior to his service as chair, Watts was selected to serve as the State Board vice-chair in 2018.

Currently, Watts is the executive director of Opportunities through Partnerships that Transform and Inspire (OptIN), a program offered by the Evansville Vanderburgh School Corporation to educate students on their options—either post-secondary or career—that best match their interests and strengths, and will give them a clear path for success. In 2018, OptIN was selected as one of five workforce development programs in the country to serve as a Community of Practice by the US Department of Education. Prior to assuming this position in 2018, Watts worked for 17 years as a teacher and coach for the EVSC, teaching social studies, science and physical education for grades K-6.

In 2000, Watts was the youngest person in history to be elected to the Evansville City Council. He served on the Council for a total of 11 years from 2000-11, including six years as president. He is a previous member of the Mesker Park Zoo Advisory Board and the Mayor's Education Roundtable, and a current member of the National Association of State Boards of Education.

In addition to his position with the EVSC, Watts is a licensed insurance broker with Freeman Will & Niemeier Inc., conducts business development for Energy Systems Group and is a Franklin Street business owner.

Watts resides in Evansville with his wife Jamie and their two sons.



# USI BESTOWS THREE HONORARY DEGREES FOR

This weekend's honorary degree recipients are celebrated in the University of Southern Indiana community for their continued dedication to higher education. The recipients also are active with many civic organizations and non-profits in Southern Indiana and the Tri-state.

Linda L. M. Bennett, Stephen E. Bennett and Betty J. Worthington will receive honorary Doctor of Laws degrees. The honorary degrees will be bestowed during the Graduate Ceremony.

Dr. Stephen E. and Dr. Linda L. M. Bennett have dedicated their lives to higher education. Together they have over 60 years of experience in the classroom and in administrative roles.

Dr. Stephen E. Bennett earned his doctorate from the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign. He was a teacher-scholar at the University of Cincinnati for 31 years until his retirement in 1999 as professor emeritus in political science. He was the senior research associate in the Institute for Policy Research at the University, and headed the Political Science Department. His teaching career included six years as an adjunct in political science at USI. He served as the associate editor for the publication *Critical Review* from 2003-2011.

Stephen was recognized at the University of Cincinnati for his prolific scholarship of more than 200 publications, including books and articles and, in 1994, was honored with the Distinguished Scholarship Award.

Dr. Linda L. M. Bennett is President Emerita of the University of Southern Indiana. She earned her doctorate in political science from the University of Cincinnati. She and Stephen published together and their work continues

to be cited in scholarly literature. She came to USI from Appalachian State University in North Carolina, where she served from 1999-2003 as dean of the College of Arts and Sciences and professor of political science. She became USI's third president in July 2009, after serving as USI's provost and vice president for Academic Affairs from 2003 to 2009.

As president, she was charged by the University trustees to establish a strategic plan. This five-year plan took the University to its 50th anniversary year and provided the foundation for the University's current strategic plan.

In 2015, the University celebrated five decades of remarkable transformation. The foresight and influence provided by Bennett brought the University to this milestone year positioned to continue a tradition of excellence in years to come.

She also led the USI Foundation's second successful capital campaign, *Campaign USI: Elevating Excellence*, concluding June 30, 2016, with gift commitments of \$57.1 million. Bennett is a civic leader, serving on numerous community boards in Evansville. She also has served on national boards in higher education. She has been recognized with a multitude of awards for her leadership, including induction into the prestigious Evansville Regional Business Hall of Fame.

The Bennetts have been generous to the University in their financial support since arriving in Evansville, and are members of the USI Foundation's C. Wayne Worthington Society.

Linda was born and raised in Cincinnati, Ohio, and Stephen was born in Peoria, Illinois. They have made Evansville their permanent home. The Bennetts are the father and step-mother of two children and have two granddaughters.

# DISTINGUISHED AND EXTRAORDINARY SERVICE

Betty J. (Siemers) Worthington has been a longtime friend of the University of Southern Indiana. Born and raised in Evansville, she is a 1941 graduate of Bosse High School. She was a director on the USI/New Harmony Foundation Board for nine years and is an ardent supporter of and advocate for the University, Historic New Harmony, New Harmony Theatre and Varsity Club.

Her husband, the late C. Wayne Worthington, served as chairman of the USI Foundation Board of Directors from 1987 to 1992, was a life director of the Foundation and a charter member of the President's Circle. He chaired the community fund drive for the Physical Activities Center, which opened in 1980. Together, they funded the C. Wayne and Betty J. Worthington Presidential Scholarship Endowment and raised funds for Rice Plaza, dedicated in 1994 in honor of the University's first president, David L. Rice, and his wife Betty.

The Worthingtons made a generous gift in 1992 to commission a portrait of President Rice on the 25th anniversary of his presidency. Mrs. Worthington continued a legacy of giving after Mr. Worthington's death in 2000,

including a commissioned portrait of President Linda L. M. Bennett. She was honored with the USI Alumni Association's Special Recognition Award in 1994; the Suzanne A. Nicholson Leadership Award in 2014; and was inducted into the President's Circle in 2015.

Mrs. Worthington is a champion of the arts, including sponsorship of exhibitions at the Evansville Museum of Arts, History & Science. Other organizations benefitting from her enthusiastic devotion over many years include the University of Evansville, Easter Seals Rehabilitation Center, the

Evansville Philharmonic Orchestra, the YWCA of Evansville, the Louis J. Koch Family Children's Museum of Evansville, Vanderburgh Humane Society, the Reitz Home and the United Way. She served as a board member and officer of the Visiting Nurses Association and the Evansville Philharmonic Board. Betty is an active member of Bethlehem United Church of Christ.

A member of Rolling Hills Country Club, Betty is an avid golfer and continues to play regularly. She served as president and treasurer of the Ladies Golf Association at Rolling Hills. She is a 50-year member of SINAWIK and a member of Hadi Shrine Honored Ladies.

The Worthingtons have three children: Sandra Worthington Kern (Mike), Steve Worthington (Susan), and Susan Worthington Head (Mike); six grandchildren; and seven great-grandchildren.

Mrs. Worthington resides in Evansville.

Honorary degrees are awarded for distinguished and extraordinary service consistent with the mission of the University. That service may be to the University itself, and/or to local, statewide, national or international communities. Individuals selected to receive an honorary degree exemplify the highest ideals of integrity, service and dedication to learning.

Candidate applications for honorary degrees from the University of Southern Indiana are reviewed by a committee defined by the honorary degree award policy. Recommendations are submitted to the president for approval by the USI Board of Trustees. Such a degree is the highest form of recognition granted by USI.

Riley K. Cornett '19, who will graduate *magna cum laude* with a Bachelor of Science degree in Communication Studies during the College of Liberal Arts Commencement Ceremony, will receive the President's Medal, the highest honor presented to a graduate in the Class of 2019.

A native of Mt. Vernon, Illinois, Cornett knew from an early age that she was drawn to educational spaces and has sought to provide and promote opportunities for students entering higher education. She is being recognized for her years of volunteer service, peer mentorship and enthusiastic passion as an advocate for USI.

During her time at USI, Cornett has served in various capacities

across multiple student organizations, including the Ruston-O'Bannon Area Council, AMIGOs, and mentorship positions within Student Ambassadors and the Honors Program.

She is praised for her work ethic, professionalism, character and performance in the classroom and in her extracurricular activities. She has been described as a high achiever, a respected leader, and as a role model for student service-leadership among her peers. As a representative of USI's student body, Cornett has spoken to members of the Indiana Commission for Higher Education and at USI's Fuquay Welcome Center opening ceremony.

While working as a radio personality for 95.7 FM The Spin, USI's student radio station, Cornett and her colleague Colin McDuffee '20 were awarded first place in the national "On Air Personality" competition of the College Broadcasters, Incorporated National Student Production Awards, and the "Radio Show" competition of the Indiana Association of School Broadcasters.

As a student, Cornett's awards and honors include the David L. Rice Merit Scholarship, Emma

A. Gorby Endowed Deans Scholarship and the 2018 Spirit of the Eagle award, awarded by USI's Student Government Association annually to those dedicated to creating a better USI.

Following her graduation, she plans to pursue a master's degree in higher education administration and student affairs with the eventual goal of employment as a dean of students in a university setting.

Cornett is the daughter of Mary and Larry Cornett. Her sister, Ashtyn, is a student at USI and plans to graduate in the fall of 2019.

# UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN INDIANA: KNOWLEDGE FOR LIFE

---



President Ronald S. Rochon became the fourth president of the University of Southern Indiana in 2018. USI's presidential seal is embossed with the motto *education by the people, education for the people*. One of Rochon's core messages following his appointment was, "This campus is a community institution. It is, and always will be, the peoples' campus."

From its initial stages of planning in the early 1960s, community leaders have supported the University by providing a solid base for its present success and future growth. For more than 50 years, the University has continued to uphold its mission under the strong leadership of its first three presidents, David L. Rice, H. Ray Hoops, Linda L. M. Bennett and now Rochon.

The University of Southern Indiana was established on September 15, 1965, in the old Centennial School Building, offering classes to 412 students. In 1967 Southern Indiana Higher Education, Inc. (SIHE) raised nearly \$1 million to acquire the land where the campus now sits. The University moved to its present site four miles west of the city limits of Evansville in September 1969. The University graduated its first class of baccalaureate degree students in 1971, and achieved initial North Central Association accreditation in 1974.

## USI Today

USI enrolls more than 11,000 undergraduate, dual credit and graduate students in more than 130 areas of study. A public higher education institution located on a beautiful 1,400-acre campus, USI offers programs through the Romain College of Business, College of Liberal Arts, College of Nursing and Health Professions, and the Pott College of Science, Engineering, and Education.

The College of Nursing and Health Professions also offers classes at the Stone Family Center for Health Sciences in downtown Evansville. The University offers study-abroad opportunities in many countries and is host to international students from around the globe.

USI is a two-time Carnegie Foundation Community Engaged University and provides continuing education and special programs to more than 20,000 participants annually through Outreach and Engagement. Outreach programs include the administration of Historic New Harmony, USI-Crane Partnership, I-69 Innovation Corridor and Lifelong Learning noncredit programs, among others.

A competitive member of NCAA Division II and the Great Lakes Valley Conference, USI offers 17 varsity intercollegiate men's and women's sports.

Under the leadership of President Rochon, the University continues a tradition of affordable excellence through innovation and engagement, and positions USI as a top choice for high-caliber college students across the state, nationally and internationally.

The University of Southern Indiana's vision is a simple but powerful one: *Shaping the future through learning and innovation*.

Its mission statement is: USI is an engaged learning community advancing education and knowledge, enhancing civic and cultural awareness, and fostering partnerships through comprehensive outreach programs. We prepare individuals to live wisely in a diverse and global community.

USI is engaged in its 2016–2020 five-year strategic plan which includes three overarching goals:

- Excellence in Learning for the Entire USI Community
- Access and Opportunity by Design
- Purposeful and Sustainable Growth

These three goals, along with the campus master plan, frame the University's strategies as it moves forward.

Today, more than 42,000 alumni have been awarded diplomas from the University of Southern Indiana. USI graduates are renowned surgeons, bank executives, artists, leaders in K-12 education, accounting executives, lawyers, nurses, hospital administrators, college professors and elected officials—and they proudly serve as role models in their communities.



# COMMENCEMENT TRADITIONS

## Presidential Medallion

During the Middle Ages, medallions signified membership in religious orders and guilds; in the Renaissance, membership in elite orders of knighthood and prominence in government office. Today, colleges and universities strike medallions to commemorate important events and achievements. The University of Southern Indiana Presidential Medallion signifies the authority bestowed upon the president.

Donated by the late Melvin Denner, professor emeritus of biology, and Anne Denner, former instructor in nutrition and biology, and their family, a medallion was fabricated by Honorcraft for the 1995 inauguration of USI President H. Ray Hoops. Dr. Denner served as grand marshal at the University's first inauguration.

For President Rochon's inauguration a new medallion was struck with the updated Seal and a new chain was fabricated. In addition to the names of USI's presidents on the reverse side of the medallion, the new chain was commissioned bearing their names on four separate plates. Made by Medalcraft Mint, Inc., the medallion and chain were underwritten by a generous gift from University trustee and alumnus, Ronald D. Romain '73 and alumna Connie Dartt Romain '74. The former medallion will be on permanent display in the David L. Rice Library's Ruth M. Kleymeyer Hall of Presidents.

During the College of Liberal Arts Ceremony, a replica of the Presidential Medallion will be presented to Riley K. Cornett '19. This is the highest honor given to a graduating senior.

## Gonfalons

Ceremonial flags called gonfalons originated in the Middle Ages for civil and military processions, often appearing beneath the steel head of a knight's lance. In Italy, gonfalons designated individual Italian republics; the chief magistrate or other high official served as gonfalonier, carrying the banner.

At the University of Southern Indiana, gonfalons represent each major academic unit; faculty members and department heads serve as gonfaloniers. First used in 2005 and presented to the University as a gift from the Campus Store, new gonfalons were needed and fabricated for the 2019 Inauguration Ceremony.

## University Seal

The University Seal, originally designed by Nussmeier Engraving and updated in 2018, bears the University's colors—blue, red and white—with gray. The shield signifies the importance of higher education in defending citizens against ignorance.

Between the two banners displaying the University's name appears an open book, illuminated by the torch of knowledge. Trees on either side of the flame suggest not only the University's pastoral Southern Indiana setting but also life, growth and continuity.

The open book emphasizes the importance of teaching and learning; *academia populi* and *academia populo* indicate that the University of Southern Indiana is a scholarly academy founded and supported by the motto *education by the people, education for the people*. Finally, the laurel branches to the right and left of the book represent victory: the light of learning overcomes the darkness of ignorance.

## University Mace

In the Middle Ages, bodyguards of French and English monarchs carried ceremonial maces. Later, the mace became an important symbol of office in civil processions and academic pageantry. At the University of Southern Indiana, the grand marshal, a distinguished member of the faculty, carries the mace.

A replica of Richard Owen's walking cane serves as the staff for the University Mace. A respected geologist and professor of natural science at Indiana University, Owen was the first president of Purdue University. He was a son of Robert Owen, the Welsh industrialist who established New Harmony, Indiana, as a center for education and enlightened social reform in the early 1800s. The 32-inch tall wooden cane was presented to Richard Owen in 1874. Through the generosity of his descendant, the late Kenneth D. Owen, that cane, lent to USI, served as the grand marshal's staff in all Commencement exercises from 1985 to 1995.

Designed and fabricated by Nicholas Logsdon of Indianapolis, the gold-plated mace bears at the top, above the cane's golden head, an open orb with a replica of the University Seal.

The orb's free-flowing design symbolizes interrelationships among all academic disciplines. Immediately below the cane's orb, three two-inch, golden rings bear the names and appointment dates of the University presidents. The names of Kenneth Dale Owen, Jane Blaffer Owen and James A. Sanders, donors of the mace, appear on a finial near the bottom of the cane replica.

Designed and created by alumnus Kenny Fisher '77, the replica of the cane and its base are made of walnut from the Owen mansion built in New Harmony during the 1830s.

# COMMENCEMENT TRADITIONS

---

## Academic Regalia

The academic garb dates from medieval days when university students wore woolen and fur garments for warmth in damp and drafty buildings. Most of those studying were clerics in holy orders; they wore a cloak to which was attached a hood that could be pulled up to cover their tonsured heads.

Simplified today, the garb serves to remind us that its wearer is a member of an ancient and venerable profession; it also indicates, by its color and design, the wearer's degree and the institution by which the degree was conferred.

In the United States, black has been the traditional color for academic gowns, but some institutions authorize holders of their doctorates to wear colors of the institution. The bachelor's gown is distinguished by its long, open sleeves; the master's by its closed, slitted sleeves; the doctor's by its full sleeves trimmed with bands of velvet, which may be black or a color denoting the field in which the degree was taken.

The mortarboard cap, proper for all degrees, is black. Tassels, usually black, are worn over the left front quarter of the cap. Holders of the doctorate may wear tassels of gold thread.

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree attained and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. Hooding signifies the induction of the graduate into the fellowship of the academy, a welcoming gesture by those who represent the high standards of scholarship and creative achievement.

Doctoral and master's degree candidates will receive hoods distinctive to their degrees. The honorary doctoral hoods of the University of Southern Indiana are black, lined with blue satin with red satin chevrons. They are edged with white velvet. Retired members of the University faculty can be recognized in today's ceremony by the red, white and blue cords or a replica of the Presidential Medallion with a blue ribbon worn with their regalia.

The Distinguished Professor Award is the highest recognition bestowed upon a faculty member at the University of Southern Indiana. Faculty who have received this award can be recognized in today's ceremony by the blue and red stole embroidered with the University Seal worn with their regalia.

## Baccalaureate Scholarship Honors

The baccalaureate degree candidate graduating with either a 4.0 or the highest grade point average graduates *summa cum laude*. Baccalaureate students with a grade point average of 3.80 or higher graduate *magna cum laude*. Those with grade point averages between 3.60 and 3.79 graduate *cum laude*. These achievements are set forth on the individual diplomas. Honor students can be recognized in the Commencement exercises by colored stoles and tassels. Gold indicates *summa cum laude*; red, *magna cum laude*; and blue, *cum laude*.

Because students enrolled in doctoral and master's degree programs are expected to maintain a minimum grade point average of 3.0, and most achieve much higher levels, scholarship honors at Commencement are given only to baccalaureate students.

## University Honors Scholars

The designation of University Honors Scholar is awarded to students who successfully complete the Honors Program. They can be recognized in the Commencement ceremony by the white honor cords worn with their regalia.

## Alumni Association Pins

Graduates in each ceremony are receiving alumni lapel pins with the University logo as a gift from the University of Southern Indiana Alumni Association. The Alumni Association was organized with the first graduating class in 1971.

## Photography During Ceremony

A commercial photographer will take a photo of each graduate as the diploma is presented on stage. A second photograph will be taken as the graduate departs from the stage. Graduates will receive proofs of the photos from which duplicates can be ordered. Family members who wish to take still or video photographs during the ceremony may do so from their seats. Your cooperation ensures the dignity of the Commencement ceremony.
